Introduction

The National Book Trust, India is an apex body established by the Government of India in the year 1957 for the promotion of books and developing reading habit in the country.

Publishing

Publishing forms a major activity of the Trust. It publishes a wide variety of reasonably priced quality books ranging from works of fiction to books on Medical Sciences and cutting edge technology for all segments of the society and for all age groups, including a wide variety of illustrated books for children. Over the years, the Trust's determined efforts in developing a strong and inclusive policy towards publishing is also apparent in the variety of books published for visually handicapped and the neo-literates.

The Trust publishes books in 18 major Indian languages, which includes Asamiya, Bangla, English, Gujarati, Hindi, Kannada, Kashmiri, Malayalam, Manipuri, Maithili, Marathi, Nepali, Odia, Punjabi, Sindhi, Tamil, Telugu and Urdu. In addition to this, the Trust has also published books in Ao Naga, Bhojpuri, Himachali, Kokborok, Khasi, Garo, Lepcha, Bhutia, Mising, Limboo, Mizo, Newari, Bodo, among others.

During the period under review 1553 titles were published by the Trust. These included 114 originals, 136 translations, 1301 reprints and 2 revised editions.

New Initiatives

As a part of its efforts to promote books and reading habit across the country and abroad, the Trust undertook some new initiatives during the financial year 2012-13. Among the major new initiatives that the Trust made during the year 2012-13 included:

To promote Indian books abroad, National Book Trust, India has initiated the *Financial Assistance Programme for Translation*. Under this scheme, financial assistance will be given by the Trust to foreign publishers keen on translating Indian books into foreign languages. The first such proposal of a short novel to be translated into Italian is under consideration.

For the first time, The Trust organised the 2-day *New Delhi Rights Table* on the occasion of New Delhi World Book Fair on 2 & 3 February 2013 at Pragati Maidan, New Delhi. The Rights Table was an attempt to bring together publishers, Rights' agents, translators and editors from India and abroad to network and explore business opportunities together.

The Trust organised the *CEOSpeak over Chairman's Breakfast Forum* during the New Delhi World Book Fair, 2013. The Forum gave an opportunity to CEOs and Senior Executives of the publishing sector from India and abroad to discuss upon the various challenges being faced by the sector.



On its 55th Foundation Day in the year 2012, the NBT initiated an *Annual Lecture series*. The Lecture invites an eminent personality from among women and men of letters, scholars, intellectuals and others who have made significant contributions to the world of publishing, to reflect largely on an overarching theme of books and reading in today's India. Dr Shashi Tharoor, Hon'ble Minister of State for Human Resource Development delivered first such lecture on 1 August 2012.

As a part of National Youth Readership Survey, the Trust in association with National Council for Applied Economic Research (NCAER), conducted a special readership survey in the North-East. The Report titled *Youth of North-East India: Demographics and Readership* gives an analytical and detailed account of the reading habit of the literate youth in the north-eastern states.

The Trust had undertaken several new initiatives during the National Book Week to promote reading habit and books especially among children. An online contest for children was organised in which they were asked to send their stories. The best entries chosen from the competition would be published in the form of a book by the National Book Trust, India. A three-day event titled *Qitaabe* at DLF Place Mall, New Delhi was also organised to draw the attention of children towards books.

The Trust had a special focus on tribal and remote areas of the country during the National Book Week and several book promotional activites were held in the states of Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Andhra Pradesh, Haryana, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Odisha, Punjab and West Bengal among others.



In its efforts to meet the growing demand of printing industry for professional manpower and help students pursue career in publishing, the Trust has signed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the University of Calcutta and Ambedkar University, Delhi for conducting book publishing courses.

In its endeavour to improve the availability of books, the NBT has entered into an MOU with the Department of Posts to sell NBT books through post offices. A pilot project has been launched at

Dehradun under the Uttarakhand Postal Circle. The project will be gradually extended to all postal circles and NBT books will be available for sale at select post offices.

To meet the growing demands of the readers and make NBT books available, the Trust for the first time entered into a private-public parternership with Kitab Khana, Mumbai and launched a dedicated NBT book shelf at the Kitab Khana bookshop in Mumbai on 23 April 2012.


Book Promotional Activities

The Trust organises Book Fairs/ Exhibitions throughout the country. The NBT is the organizer of the prestigious annual New Delhi World Book Fair. NBT has so far organised 21 New Delhi World Book Fairs, 39 National Book Fairs and more than 215 Regional Books Fairs.

Book Fairs in India

During the period from April 2012 to March 2013, the Trust organised 18 Book Fairs across the country

including Gurgaon Book Festival (20 - 23 April 2012); Jahanabad Book Festival (23 - 25 April 2012); Ahmedabad National Book Fair (1 - 7 May 2012); Shimla Book Fair (12 - 17 May 2012); Nizamuddin Book Exhibition (17 - 19 July 2012); Patiyali Book Fair (11 - 13 August 2012); Jaipur Book Fair (8 - 10 October 2012); Trichy Book Fair (5 - 14 October 2012); Aligarh Book Fair (17 - 21 October 2012); Bathinda Book Fair (27 October to 4 November 2012); Kozhikode Book Fair (3 - 11 December 2012);



Cuttack Book Fair (15-23 December 2012); New Delhi World Book Fair (4 – 10 February 2013); 3 in Northeast and 2 in Jammu and Kashmir.

The Trust also stepped-up its book promotional activities in the North-east through a number of book fairs, literary activities and special sales drive. During the year under review, the Trust organised Khowai Book Fair (4 - 10 November 2012); Sikkim Book Fair (15 - 20 March 2013) and Nazira Book Fair (23 - 21 March 2013) and participated actively in about 4 Book Fairs held in the region. Besides, the Trust also organised special exhibits of the Trust's publications at various colleges and universities in the region. Among the significant literary events organised during the period include workshop on *Disseminating Science: A Workshop on Science Translation* at North Lakimpur, meet-the-author programmes, discussion on *Re-telling of Popular Folktales as Pleasure Reading Materials for Children* and cultural programmes at Sikkim and Nazira Book Fairs. The Trust also organised the Training Course in Book Publishing in Guwahati.

The Trust has also broadened its activities in Jammu & Kashmir to create book-mindedness and make NBT books available to the people in the valley. During the year under review, the Trust organised Srinagar Book Fair (2-10 June 2012) and Leh Book Exhibition (4-9 August 2012). Several literary programmes especially for children including meet the author programme with Prof. Manoj Das and Shri Ghulam Nabi Aatash and Mehfil-e-ghazal, panel discussions and seminars were organised during Srinagar Book Fair.

International Book Fairs

In order to promote Indian books abroad, the Trust participates in various International Book Fairs by



displaying a cross section of representative Indian publications brought out by various Indian publishers. Since 1970, the Trust has participated in more than 330 International Book Fairs. During the period under review, the Trust participated in 14 such International Book Fairs, including the prestigious Nigeria International Book Fair (7-12 May 2012); Tehran International Book Fair (2-12 May 2012); Cape Town Book Fair (15-17 June 2012); Seoul International Book Fair (20-24 June 2012); Tokyo International Book Fair (5-8 July 2012); Nepal Education & Book Fair (6-14 July 2012); Colombo International Book Fair (18-26 September 2012); Beijing International Book Fair (29 August - 3 September 2012); Frankfurt Book Fair (10 - 14

October 2012); Sharjah International Book Fair (7-17 November 2012); Istanbul International Book Fair (17-20 November 2012); Minsk International Book Fair (6-10 February 2013); Jerusalem International Book Fair (10 - 15 February 2013); and Bologna Children's Book Fair (25-28 March 2013).

Besides, the Trust was invited to be a member of Advisory Board of Asian Festival of Children's Content held in Singapore on 29 May 2012 and it also participated in the China Eurasia Publication Expo (1 - 5 September 2012); and 9th World Hindi Conference held in Johannesburg, South Africa from 22 to 24 September 2012.

Mobile Exhibitions

The Trust has been trying to make the books available to the people at their doorsteps through mobile exhibitions. So far it has organised more than 12,000 Mobile Exhibitions throughout the country including the Northeastern states. During the period under report, the Trust organised Mobile Book Exhibitions at about 1,571 places in and around Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, Jharkhand, Kerala, Mizoram, Nagaland, New Delhi, Punjab, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand and West Bengal.

Financial Assistance Programmes

The Ministry of Human Resource Development had entrusted the scheme of Financial Assistance to Voluntary/Private organisations for organising Seminars/Training Courses/Workshops/Annual Conventions/Book Fairs related to the Book Promotional Activities to the Trust. A number of organisations had applied for financial assistance for organising various Book Promotional Activities. Grants were released to 224 organisations during 2012-13 by the Trust to meet 75% of the approved expenditure of such Book Fairs, Seminars, etc.

Besides, the Trust also provides assistance to authors and publishers for the publication of reasonably priced university level text and reference books and for books on Medical Science under its Subsidy Scheme. During the year under review, one title was published under this scheme.

Literary Activities

The Trust organises several book-related activities across the country. It organises workshops and seminars for those involved in the development, production and distribution of books. It also organises

authors' meets and other literary activities such as book release functions from time to time. During the period under review, over 200 activities were organised by the Trust.

National Centre for Children's Literature (NCCL)

The Trust also has a National Centre for Children's Literature (NCCL), which is the nodal agency to monitor, coordinate, plan and aid the publication of children's literature in various Indian languages. The NCCL has developed a library-cum-documentation centre of children's literature. It organises workshops, seminars and exhibitions to develop the children's literature of the country. With a view to promote and develop the reading habit of the children at the school level, the NCCL encourages setting up of Readers' Clubs at the schools throughout the country and also



conducts surveys and takes up research work relating to children's literature. So far, over 35,000 Readers Clubs have been set up across the country. During the period under review, the NCCL established 1,000 Readers Clubs, besides organising meet-the-author programmes, story telling sessions, workshops, seminars, Readers Club Orientation programmes and other children's activities in various parts of the country. In addition, 12 monthly issues of Readers' Club Bulletin, a bilingual magazine for promotion of reading habit among children were also brought out.

Language Advisory Panel Meetings

To guide and support its publishing programme in various Indian languages under different series, the Trust constitutes advisory panel for each language from time to time. The panel comprises of eminent authors, scholars, translators, academicians, publishers and professionals in the field of publishing. During the year 2012-13, nine advisory panel meetings were held including Urdu Advisory Panel Meeting in New Delhi on 28 May 2012; Telugu Advisory Panel Meeting in Hyderabad, Andhra Pradesh on 16 June 2012; Odia Advisory Panel Meeting in Bhubaneshwar, Odisha on 17 June 2012; Bangla Advisory Panel Meeting in Kolkata, West Bengal on 8 August 2012; Konkani Advisory Panel Meeting in Panjim, Goa on 13 August 2012; Kannada Advisory Panel Meeting in Bengaluru, Karnataka on 5 November 2012; Malayalam Advisory Panel Meeting in Ernakulam, Kerala on 7 November 2012; Kashmiri Advisory Panel Meeting in New Delhi on 12 December 2012; and Tamil Advisory Panel Meeting in Chennai, Tamil Nadu on 22 December 2012.

Book Promotional Activities by the NBT Regional Offices

Besides the Northern Regional Office at its headquarters, the Trust also has three Regional Offices at Bengaluru, Mumbai and Kolkata. The regional offices are primarily responsible for the marketing and sales of NBT publications. The regional offices also participate in various Book Fairs organised both by the Trust and other agencies throughout the country. The regional offices also organise NBT book exhibitions at various places in their respective regions. The regional offices are also responsible for enlisting distributors and agents for the sale of NBT publications. During the period under report, 98 new agents/distributors were enrolled. It also enrolled 8,102 new Book Club members.

NBT Book Counters

The Trust also has a book counter each at the HQs, Vasant Kunj, CCIC, Janpath, Daryaganj in New Delhi and at the Trust's regional offices.

National Book Week



Every year during the National Book Week from 14-20 November, the Trust organises a number of book promotional activities throughout the country to promote book mindedness among the masses. This year National Book Week was celebrated far more extensively, some new initiatives were taken and a special attention was given to tribal and remote areas of the country like Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Andhra Pradesh, Odisha among others. The National Book Week saw the participation of a large number of children from various schools and NGOs across

the country. NBT also organised book exhibitions throughout the country. Besides, a number of book promotional activities, which included online contests for children, seminars, book review sessions, meet-the-author programmes, poets' meet and book release functions were held all over the country.

Training Courses in Book Publishing

The Trust also organises short term Training Courses in Book Publishing in various parts of the country with the objective to create a talent pool of trained professionals for the publishing industry. While a four-week Training Course in Book Publishing at Delhi has become an annual feature, it also conducts short-term training courses of one-to-two week duration in other parts of the country. During the period under report, apart from four-week Training Course in New Delhi, three short-term publishing courses were also held in Bengaluru, Goa and Guwahati.

Financial Performance

During the year beginning April 2012 to March 2013, the Trust achieved net sales of Rs. 2087.47 lakh. The revenue earned during this period was to the tune of Rs. 1950.09 lakh.

Financial performance for the year 2012-2013 is as follows:

Publishing

The NBT provides a wide variety of books for all age groups on all subjects keeping in view the needs of its readers and demands of a fluctuating market. A brief note on the various series and on the number of books published under each series during 2012–2013 is as follows:

India — The Land and the People

Books in this series introduce the varied physical environment, the diverse cultural traditions and the flora and fauna have enriched the composite and colourful character of India. These books, written in a non-technical, lucid style by subject experts, provide authentic and up-to-date information on the subject.

Sixty seven titles were published during the year comprising 5 originals, 4 translation, 56 reprints and 2 revised. These include 1 in Asamiya, 6 in Bangla, 27 in English, 18 in Hindi, 11 in Marathi and 4 in Urdu. Significant titles published include *Contemporary Indian Theatre, The Ailing Forests of India, Adivasi Duniya* and *Uttarakhand Mein Rajasvya Police.*

Popular Science

This series aims at enabling the average educated reader to understand the world around them appreciate the progress of science, and learn about the role science and technology play in everyday life, emphasizing, wherever possible, India's contribution to the field. The books in this series are written in a lucid, easy-to-understand, simple style and illustrated with anecdotes and analogies from daily life. Diagrams, sketches and photographs elucidate the text.

One hundred and eleven titles were published during the year, including 3 originals, 14 translations, 94 reprints. The language-wise editions include 6 in Asamiya, 4 in Bangla, 43 in English, 30 in Hindi, 1 in Kannada, 20 in Marathi, 1 in Punjabi, 1 in Malayalam, 2 in Odia, 1 in Telugu, 1 in Gujarati and 1 in Urdu. New titles published were *Mines, Minerals and Environment in Human Life, Worlds Apart:Science Fiction Stories* and *Vishwa Ke Prasidh Beejganatigya*.

Young India Library

The main objective of publishing books under the Young India Library series for young readers of the $18 \pm$ age-group is to introduce the social, economic and political concepts, issues and choices which will control them in the years to come. Stories of adventure and travel, and books on career opportunities are also included in this series.

Thirty-four titles were published during the year, including 2 originals, 1 translation, and 31 reprints. Language-wise break-up of the titles is as follows: 1 in Asamiya, 3 in Bangla, 5 in English, 7 in Hindi, 13 in Marathi, 2 in Malayalam, 1 in Punjabi and 2 in Urdu. Significant titles among these are *Kashmir Se Kanyakumari Tak* and *Syed Zohhor Qasim*.

Aadan Pradan

Aadan Pradan is a series of particular importance because of its unique potential for forging national integration through the exchange of creative literature of the different regions. It presents well-known literary works, mainly novels, short stories, anthologies of popular poetry and reminiscences, of a particular language, to people of other Indian languages.

A total of 124 titles were published under the series during the year including 20 originals, 16 translations and 88 reprints. Of these, 4 were in Asamiya, 8 in Bangla, 3 in English, 37 in Hindi, 1 in Bhojpuri, 1 in Gujarati, 47 in Marathi, 1 in Malayalam, 11 in Punjabi, 4 in Odia, 2 in Telugu, 4 in Urdu and 1 in Tamil. Significant titles include *Kuthiraigal Pesa Marukindrana, Narayante Thiranjedutha Kathakal, Bangla Kavita Sankalan, Dhritrashtra, Yuddhnaad* and *Akbar Allahbadi: Selected Poetry.*

Classics

Since only contemporary works are published under *Aadan Pradan* series, Classical Indian Literature is brought out under this series.

During the year, 3 titles were reprinted of which 2 were in Hindi and 1 in Marathi, namely *Panchatantra Ki Kahaniyan, Bankim Chandra Selected Essays* and *Lokmanya Tilakanche Nibandh.*

Folklore

The *Folklore* series enables the readers of one region to get acquainted with folklore which had shaped the cultural identity of those living in other regions of the country. Descriptions of the area, people, myths, mythology, religion, customs, traditions, fairs and festivals, music, dance, drama, art & craft, and folk literature are also included in the books of this series.

Eleven titles were published during the year, including 2 originals, and 9 reprints. Of these 1 were in Asamiya, 3 in English, 3 in Hindi, 3 in Marathi and 1 in Punjabi. Significant titles include *Pari Rukh: Punjab Diyan Lok Kathavan* and *Bastar Ki Lok Kathayein*.

National Biography

The objective of the *National Biography* series is to bring out biographies of Indian women and men who have made outstanding contribution towards the development of Indian society, culture, science, economy, polity as also of modern Indian sensibility. These provide an authentic, objective, comprehensive and analytic account of the person's life and times.

Under this series, 117 titles were published during the year. These include 10 originals, 10 translations and 97 reprints. The language-wise break-up is as follows, Asamiya : 9, Bangla : 8, English: 6, Hindi : 26, Marathi : 61, Punjabi : 3, Tamil : 1, Telugu : 1, Gujarati : 1 and Malayalam : 1. Significant titles include

Michael Madhusudan Dutta, Desh Ratna Rajendra Prasad, Maulvi Ahmadullah Shah and Guru Ramdas Jeevan Te Bani.

Autobiography

This series comprises autobiographies of distinguished social, political and literary figures of India, whose contributions have made the country proud.

During the year, 2 original titles were published in English. The significant title include *Breaking Ground: Journey into the Media and Out.*

Nehru Bal Pustakalaya

The *Nehru Bal Pustakalaya* series aims at creating a treasure-house of enjoyable and informative literature which children can read at their own initiative. It also promotes national integration by providing common reading material on a wide range of subjects in their mother tongue to children all over India. Books of this series cater to four age groups: pre-school, 6–8, 9–11 and 12–14. Illustrations material for these books is commissioned separately and all books carry colour and / or black & white illustrations, line drawings and photographs. In the case of books for pre-school children, the text, if any, revolves around multi-coloured pictures which tell a story by themselves.

During the year, 788 titles were published under the series. These include 32 originals, 72 translations and 684 reprints. The language-wise break-up is as follows: Asamiya: 18, Bangla: 30, English: 143, Hindi: 266, Marathi: 205, Odia: 11, Punjabi: 33, Telugu: 12, Kannada: 3, Tamil: 7, Malayalam: 4, Urdu: 29, Boro : 6, Gujarati : 20 and Kashmiri : 1. Significant titles include *Rabindranather Shishu Sahitya, A Wet Summer Day, Happy Hundredth Birthday Delhi, Magic Islands, Bolne Wali Gaadi, Do Bal Natak* and *Ek Thi Bakri.*

Books for the Neo-literates

Most books published under the series are the outcome of workshops organised in rural areas with the participation of local people. To make these relevant to the needs of the neo-literates, the books are written in an idiom familiar to them and are field-tested. Short stories, biographies, novelettes, folktales, presentations of contemporary issues and functionally useful information are brought out in a style which attracts neo-literates to read at their own initiative.

Under this series, 138 titles were published during the year, comprising 21 originals, 2 translations and 115 reprints. These include: 3 in Bangla, 2 in Kannada, 65 in Hindi, 50 in Mararthi, 6 in Asamiya, 10 in Gujarati and 2 in Urdu. Significant titles include *Bakri Ka Bachcha, Ek Thi Sultana, Hum Sub Ek Hein, Roshni* and *Udaan.*

Creative Learning Series

The objective of this series is to bring out books on new educations concepts and tools that are now being actively implemented in the pre-primary and primary sectors of education. With an orientation towards a practical mode of approach, these books are specially designed keeping in view the needs of teaches and others working in the field of education.

During the year, 32 titles were published under the series. These include 2 originals, 2 translation, and

28 reprints. Language-wise break-up is: 3 in Bangla, 1 in English, 2 in Gujarati, 19 in Hindi and 9 in Marathi. Significant titles include *Hamara Kya Kasur* and *Pariksha Guru*.

Popular Social Science

The books under this series introduce popular concepts and ideas of social sciences to the general reader. A variety of emerging subject areas like gender studies, tribal studies, peace and conflict studies, development economics, social formation, etc. are the major focus of the series.

Thirty-three titles were published under this series. These included 3 originals, 10 translations and 20 reprints, of which 1 was in Asamiya, 4 in Bangla, 5 in English, 7 in Hindi, 9 in Marathi, 3 in Punjabi, 2 in Kannada, 1 in Malayalam and 1 in Urdu. Significant titles include *Poll Surveys of Media* and *Gram Niyojan.*

Indian Diaspora Studies

The books under this series seek to bring out the salient features of the impact of cross-cultural interaction, alienation and exile, displacement, immigration, etc. on various knowledge systems like literature, sociology, culture, philosophy, etc. Emerging as a significant field of study, NBT's foray into this area of publishing is a pioneering effort.

During the year under review, three titles were published in the series, which included 1 translation and 2 reprints. These included 1 each in Hindi, English and Punjabi. The significant titles include *Surinam* and *Fiji : A Midnight Journey.*.

General Series

Significant titles which cannot be covered under the above series are published as *General* titles. Books published under this series provide an in-depth study of the subject and also serve as authentic reference material.

During the year, 41 titles were published, including 10 originals, 2 translations and 29 reprints. Languagewise break-up of the titles is as follows: 1 in Asamiya, 4 in English, 1 in Dogri, 13 in Hindi, 13 in Marathi, 5 in Bangla, 1 in Kannada, 1 in Odia, and 2 in Punjabi. Among the significant titles published include *Purascha Rabindra Kriti, Soch, Cricket Umpires, Sachin ke Sau Shatak* and *Meri Yaadon ka Pahaad.*

Continuing Education Series

The objective of this series is to bring out books for the participants of Continuing Education Programme in all major languages of India. Books in this series include collection of freedom songs, books on Indian culture, polity, industry, agriculture etc. Besides, the series also comprises biographies and major novels of Indian literature abridged for target readership.

Under this series, 31 titles were published this year, of which 1 was original, 1 translation and 29 were reprints. Language-wise break-up is: 5 in Bangla, 13 in Hindi, 12 in Marathi, and 1 in Urdu. Significant titles include *Lal Bahadur Shastri* and *Bhartiya Swatantra Mei Mahilayein*.

Asian / Pacific Co-publication Programme

This is a novel attempt under the aegis of UNESCO, at developing books for Asian children by Asian authors. To have children in Korea share their fantasies with their counterparts in Sri Lanka is probably

no mean achievement. And when Indian and Pakistani editors work as part of a team to build a list of children in the 20 odd countries of the continent we inhabit, it is a great new beginning. The many worlds from Tehran to Tokyo intermingle to give colour to words that children across the continent, if not the world, would love to read. These books are steps for bridging minds and creating a common heritage for this vast continent and are the very best of Asia today.

During the year, 5 titles were reprinted under the series. These included 1 in Gujarati, 3 in Hindi and 1 in Marathi. Significant titles include *Guess What I am Doing* and *Laughing Together*.

World Literature Series

Select novels and anthologies of contemporary writings from the Asian, African and Latin American countries are included in this series.

Under this series, six titles were published during the year, including 1 translation and 5 reprints which included 2 in Marathi and 1 title each in Bangla, English, Hindi and Odia. Significant titles included *The Legend of Phoenix and other Stories, Bridging Connections* and *Hot Days Long Nights.*

Golden Jubilee Series


During the Golden Jubilee Year of the Trust in 2007, a series of special anthologies of Post Independence writings in various Indian languages were initiated.

During the year under review, seven titles were published which included 1 original and 6 reprints. These include three each in Bangla and Marathi and 1 in Urdu. Significant titles include *Aaj ki Kahani*, *Desh Kaal: Kavita* and *Paridrishya*.

New Delhi World Book Fair, 2013



The Trust in collaboration with India Trade Promotion Organisation organised the annual New Delhi World Book Fair from 4 to 10 February 2013 at Pragati Maidan, New Delhi. The Fair was inaugurated by Dr Shashi Tharoor, Hon'ble Minister of State for Human Resource Development.

Dr Karan Singh, Hon'ble Member of Parliament (Rajya Sabha) and President, Indian Council for Cultural Relations was the Guest of Honour on the occasion. Mr François Richier, Ambassador of France for India, Ms Rita Menon, Chairperson-cum-Managing Director, India Trade Promotion Organisation, Shri Sudhir Malhotra, President, Federation of Indian Publishers were the special guests on the occasion.

Later during the day, Shri Vineet Joshi, Chairman, CBSE inaugurated the Children & Youth Pavilion. He also released three NBT titles in English and one title in Kashmiri for children entitled *My First Aeroplane Journey*, *Boond, A Helping Hand* and *Haput Ti Tangi Haatch* respectively.




Desaj: A Festival of Folk and Tribal Performances was inaugurated by Ms Teejan Bai,



Padmabhushan and Sangeet Natak Akademi Awardee at Lal Chowk, Pragati Maidan. Ms Leela Samson, Chairman, Sangeet Natak Akademi was the special guest on the occasion. The Festival synchronized with the theme of the Fair and was organised in collaboration with the Sangeet Natak Akademi. Ms Teejan Bai also gave a lively performance on *Pandavani*, a traditional performing art form of Chhattisgarh.

More than 1200 publishers, booksellers and distributors participated in the Fair including foreign participants from 30 countries like Abu Dhabi, China, South Korea, France, Germany, Nepal, Turkey, Saudi Arabia, Pakistan, United Kingdom. In addition, international bodies such as the World Bank, WHO and UNESCO also participated in the event.

The theme of the Fair was *Indigenous Voice: Mapping India's Folk and Tribal Literature*. The theme was an attempt to map some of the writings on tribal and folk literature as well as works by and on tribals. The impressive Theme Pavilion at Hall 7E showcased colossal replicas of the dwelling abodes of our communities living in the South, the West, the North, the East as well as the Northeast. Panels on various traditional storytelling art forms like *Kalamkari*, an ancient style of painting from Andhra



Pradesh; *Pattachitra* painting from Odisha; *Gond Art* from central India etc were also put up. Over 500 books in English, Hindi and other Indian languages including tribal languages were displayed at the Pavilion. Several discussions and seminars at the Pavilion were also held in which writers and scholars from across the country participated.

For the first time, the concept of Guest of Honour Country was introduced at the New Delhi World Book Fair and France was honoured as the frist Guest

Country at the Fair. In partnership with the Bureau for the International Promotion of French Books

(BIEF), the Embassy of France in India and the Institut français en Inde, the French publishers displayed more than 2,000 French titles at the French Pavilion and hosted many literary events during the Fair. The French Pavilion also showcased various aspects of French culture through a photographic exhibition entitled *France Remains, French Delicacies: Le Bistrot,* French Cuisine and a series of film screenings at Shakuntalam were the regular events throughout the Fair.





The French Delegation included institutions, authors, publishers, and students. The participations from institutions included Alain Gründ, President, BIEF; Jean-Guy Boin, Director, BIEF; Christine Karavias, Project Manager, BIEF and Muriel Vandeventer, Policy Officer for Books, Ministry of Foreign Affairs. The authors included Tahar Ben Jelloun, Kenizé Mourad and Dominique Sigaud while publishers at the show were Hatier & Didier Jeunesse; Casterman - Flammarion/ Père Castor –

Autrement; Esmod Publishers; Le Seuil; Stock; Le Seuil; Nathan Jeunesse; to name a few.

Children & Youth Pavilion: At the Children & Youth Pavilion at Hall 7D, National Centre for Children's Literature, a wing of NBT exhibited about 230 select books for children complementing with the theme of the Fair in all the Indian languages including Assamese, Bangla, English, Gujarati, Hindi, Kannada, Malayalam, Marathi and Odia. Many programmes for children and young including workshops, career counseling sessions, panel discussions, skits, interaction with



authors and illustrators etc were organised. About 10,000 visitors especially children and young visited the Pavilion and admired the exhibition of books.

Swami Vivekananda Pavilion: To commemorate the 150th Birth Anniversary of Swami Vivekananda, the National Book Trust, India in association with the Advaita Ashram, Kolkata, dedicated a special Pavilion on the great saint of India at the Fair. The Pavilion showcased original photographs and books on Swami Vivekananda.

This year many new initiatives were taken by the Trust for the benefit of the readers and promotion of books and reading habit among people. These included:

- *New Delhi Rights Table*: The Rights Table was organised on 2 & 3 Febraury 2013 at Pragati Maidan, New Delhi. The Rights Table was an attempt to bring together publishers, Rights' agents, translators and editors from India and abroad to network and explore business opportunities together. The Rights Table offered B2B 'match-making' sessions between publishers.
- *CEOSpeak over Chairman's Breakfast Forum*: The Trust in association with FCCI organised CEOSpeak over Chairman's Breakfast Forum on 5 February 2013. Dr Shashi Tharoor, Hon'ble Minister of State for Human Resource Development was the chief guest on the occasion. CEOs and Senior Executives of the publishing sector discussed the opportunities and challenges faced by the sector. Besides a congregation of leading CEOs from Indian publishing sector, the Forum witnessed the participation of foreign publishing houses.
- Illustrator's Corner: To recognize the contributions and efforts of an illustrator in making a children's book popular as the author, an Illustrator's Corner was put up in the Children & Youth Pavilion in which the original works of all leading artists of India were displayed. An attraction at this Corner was the on-the-spot portrait sketches of visitors made by an artist. Among the visitors who had their sketches done was Prof. K.V. Thomas, Hon'ble Minister of State for Agriculture and Consumer Affairs & Public Distribution.
- Author's Corners: For the first time in the New Delhi World Book Fair history, NBT, India introduced Author's Corners at various halls of the Pragati Maidan. These Corners served as platform for authors and writers to interact with readers, to read out from their works, to share their views, to discuss some issues, to launch books and to introduce their e-books. Some of the writers who interacted included: Shri Namwar Singh, Shri Siroj Singh

• Book Art Installation: The Trust in association with College of Art, New Delhi introduced the concept of Book Art Installation at the Fair. These installations were an expression of the idea of reading, permeating all nooks and corners of human life. The installations like *The Evergreen Pond, The Wisdom Mine, The Imaginative School Bag, Eiffel Tower* attracted a large number of visitors at the Fair.



The 7-day long Fair occupied the book lovers of all age-groups as several book release functions, seminars, conferences, panel discussions, workshops

etc were organised. This year a large number of book lovers visited the Fair, especially school and college students.

Many distinguished personalities like Shri B.P. Singh, Governor of Sikkim, Shri Manish Tiwari, Minister of State for Information & Broadcasting, H.E. Mohamed Sultan Abdalla Al-Owais, the Ambassador of UAE to India, Mr Ahmed Al Amri, Director, Sharjah International Book Fair, Shri Jagdish Tytler, Congress Party leader, Prof. Shyam Menon, Vice-Chancellor, Ambedkar University, Prof. Mool Chand Sharma, Vice-Chancellor, Haryana Central University, Prof. Ranbir Singh, Vice Chancellor, National Law University, Delhi, Shri Namwar Singh, eminent writer, Ms Anamika, noted author, Shri Farooq Sheikh, renowned actor, Prof. Yash Pal, noted scientist, Dr Madhu Pant, eminent author for children among others marked their presence at the Fair.



Poland will be the Guest of Honour Country for the next edition of New Delhi World Book Fair scheduled to be held from 15 to 23 February 2014. This was declared by Shri A Sethumadhavan, Chairman, NBT in a function held at the Conference Hall in Pragati Maidan on 9 February 2013 in the presence of Prof. Piotr Klodwski, Ambassador of the Republic of Poland, Embassy of the Republic of Poland in New Delhi. Shri M A Sikandar thanked France for being the Guest of Honour country at the New Delhi World Book Fair 2013. Mr Max Claudet, Counsellor for Culture and Cooperation, Embassy of France in India

said that France had a good experience for being the first Guest of Honour Country at the Fair. He also appreciated the response of people at the Fair. Ms Rita Menon, Chairman & Managing Director, India Trade Promotion Organisation was also present on the occasion.

Activities during New Delhi World Book Fair, 2013

- 1. A panel discussion on the topic *Role of Parents in Promotion of Pleasure Reading* was organised at the Children & Youth Pavilion on 4 February 2013. The discussion was chaired by Shri Ramendra Kumar, well known writer. Ms Sangeeta Sethi, popular writer, Shri Ashok K. - 2. - 40. A workshop on *Warli Art Form* was organised at the Theme Pavilion on 8 February 2013. Shri Jivya Soma Mashe, one of India's greatest exponents of Warli art forms and his grandson Kishore Soma Mashe demonstrated the creative process involved in painting the traditional Warli art. This art form is practiced by women of Warli, an indigenous community of western India. Shri Jivya Mashe is the first male artist to practice this art form.
- 41. A workshop on *Puli Kali Make-up*, recreational popular folk art of Kerala was organised in association with Thrissu Pulikali Sangam, Thrissur at the Theme Pavilion on 8 February 2013. The workshop was conducted by Prof. C.R. Rajagopalan, Director, Institute of Kerala Studies, Calicut University. During the workshop various steps involved in painting the bare bodies of the performers were described.
- 42. A panel discussion on the topic *Inventing Traditions: Orality Folk Literature and Performance* was organised at the Theme Pavilion on 9 February 2013. The panelists discussed about the various aspects of the folk tradition in India, its history and the need to save the tradition. The discussion was



chaired by Prof. Satchidanandan and the panelists included Dr Muthukumaraswamy, Prof. C Rajagopalan, Dr Anup Ranjan Pandey, Dr Prakash Khandge, Dr Arjun Dev Charan, Dr Sanjay Kumar, Dr Badrinarayan Tiwari and Dr Koyamkoya.

43. Cosplay or costume play, a special activity for young children was organised at the Children's Activity Corner at Hall No. 18 on 9 February 2013. The young participants chose costumes of their favorite story book characters and played out the character in their own way. The favorite

characters of children ranged from Van Winkle to characters from the epics *Ramayana* and *Mahabharata*.

44. NBT in collaboration with Sahitya Akademi organised All India Writers' Meet at Auditorium 2, Hall No. 18 on 9 February 2013. The meet was inaugurated by Shri Vishwanath Prasad Tiwari, Acting President of Sahitya Akademi. The participants in the meet discussed about the importance of Indian literature and languages. Dr. Pratibha Ray, eminent writer was the chief guest on the occasion. Prof. Satchidanandan, eminent writer was the Guest of Honour at the Meet. Later during the day,



poetry reading session, story reading session and a seminar on *Myth Memory and Imaginations: Tribal and Oral Literature* was organised in which renowned Indian writers including Mamang Dai, Jiban Norah, Ganga Prasad Vimal among others participated.

- 45. Fun with Books and Reading a workshop by Readers' Club Activists, Shri Chinmay Dutta and Ms Jaishree Sethi was organised at the Children's and Youth Pavilion on 9 February 2013. The speakers interacted with students and informed them about several elements required to make the storytelling interactive.
- 46. A Young Writers' Meet was organised at the Children & Youth Pavilion on 9 February 2013. Dr. Pratibha Ray, Jnanpith award winner was the chief guest on the occasion. Dr. Ray gave tips to the young budding writers for developing writing skills. Dr Judith Oriel, Book Attaché with the Embassy of France was the special guest at the function.



- 47. A session on *Career Counseling* with Ms Usha Albuquerque, prominent career counseller and psychologist was organised at the Children & Youth Pavilion on 9 February 2013. Ms Albuquerque interacted with many young adults and gave them guidance on how to choose a career and develop skills for it.
- 48. Ms Surinder Kaur, Captain of Indian Women's Hockey Team and Shri Ravinder Sangwan, well- known wrestler interacted with the people at the Children & Youth Pavilion on 9 February 2013. Two books, published by the NBT, namely *Mera Pehla Hawai Safar* and *Bolne Wali Gaadi* were released by the celebrities.
- 49. Fun-filled activities including *Haryanvi Folk Dance*, *Role play on Importance of Books*, a skit on *TV versus Books* and patriotic and inspirational songs were presented by the children at the Children & Youth Pavilion on 9 February 2013.



- 50. A workshop on Lakshwadeep's folk art form Doli Pattu was organised at the Theme Pavilion on 9 February 2013. The workshop was conducted by Dr Koymmakoya, former Secretary of Kala Akademi, Lakshwadeep. The artists from Rajeev Memorial Arts & Sports Recreation Club, Kadamat Island, rendered Sufi songs during the session.
 - organised a puppet show at the Children & Youth Pavilion on 10 February 2013. Shri Purna Bhatt of Sangeet Natak Academi conducted the programme. Several other programmes including a skit titled Duniya Sab Ki in association with Aga Khan Foundation, Finger Puppet Show by Children's Creative Club, an NGO from Mewat, Haryana and Word Puzzle by Sawan Kripal Ruhani Mission, Poem Recital and Role Play by Sakshi, an NGO and a workshop on storytelling by Katha, an NGO were also organised at the Pavilion.
- 52. Ms Shanti Devi, one of India's most well-known and internationally recognized artist of Madhubani style of painting demonstrated her skills everyday at the Theme Pavilion. During the Fair, she painted important news covered in the newspapers.
- 53. As a part of Desaj Festival, traditional tribal performances by the artists from across the country enthralled the visitors throughout the fair which included:

Thang-Ta from Manipur, Traditional Bhajans from Gujarat, Bastar Band from Chhattisgarh, Pulikali and Naada Samanwayam from Kerala, Lai Haraoba from Manipur, Jhumur & Nagpuri Songs from Jharkhand, Choliya Dance & Lok Geet from Uttarakhand, Kabui Naga Dance from Manipur, Mand

from Rajasthan, Bihu Dance from Assam, Ragini from Haryana, Bhand Pather from Jammu & Kashmir, Bamboo Symphony from Kerala, Dance & Music of Ao Tribe from Nagaland, Purulia Chhau from West Bengal, Naqqal from Punjab, Parichakkali & Attam from Lakshadweep, Raas & Mayur Dance from Uttar Pradesh, Bagrumba & Bodo Dance from Assam, Bohura Godhani from Bihar, Ghumara from Odisha, Hojagiri from Tripura, Bohada Dance from Maharashtra, Dhol Cholom from Manipur and Bajashal Dance from Odisha.

Book Fairs organized by the Trust during 2012-13

With the objective of promoting book culture in the country, National Book Trust, India organizes book fairs/exhibitions throughout the country at regional and national level.

During the period from April 2012 to March 2013, the Trust organised the following book fairs in different parts of the country including New Delhi World Book Fair, 2013.

1. Gurgaon Book Festival (20-23 April 2012)

The Trust in collaboration with Fortis Memorial Research Institute (FMRI) organised the Gurgaon Book Festival at the Hospital grounds, FMRI, Gurgaon from 20 to 23 April 2012. Shri Gurcharan Das, renowned author and columnist inaugurated the Festival. The participants were housed in beautiful pagoda style tents at the hospital grounds. Thousands of visitors browsed through the books on a wide variety of subjects. Special workshops for children and activities like song and dance, pirate adventures, crafty corner, sand art as well as brain games and fun puzzles brought a large number of children's attention to the Festival. 50 publishers participated in the Festival.

2. Jahanabad Book Festival (23-25 April 2012)

The Trust organised the Jahanabad Book Festival at the Indoor Stadium, Jahanabad, Bihar from 23 to 25 April 2012. Shri D. Balamurugan, DM, Jahanabad inaugurated the Festival. Prof. Arun Kamal, distinguished poet presided over the function. Ms. Harpreet Kaur, Prof. Husain-ul-Haq and Prof. B.P.N. Sinha were the speakers on the occasion. The Festival witnessed a stream of visitors from various sections of the society, particularly from student community. Several literary programmes were organised during the Festival.

3. Ahmedabad National Book Fair (1-7 May 2012)

The Trust in association with Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation and Gujarati Sahitya Parishad organised the Ahmedabad National Book Fair at Vallab Sadan, Sabarmati Riverfront, Ahmedabad, Gujarat from 1 to 7 May 2012. Shri Narendra Modi, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Gujarat inaugurated the Fair. He said that every home should have a 'temple' stacked with books. Culture flows in a family that reads books. He said that books are like seeds that grow into trees of ideas, bloom as flowers of imagination and as fruits of hope. A host of literary activities were also organised during the seven days which included author meets, book release functions, poet's meet, cultural programmes, children's activities, etc. Books in Gujarati, Hindi, English, Urdu and other languages were exhibited covering various subjects from children's literature to scientific discoveries, motivational to religious and spiritual subjects, folklore and mythology to modern literary creations. 200 publishers and book distributors from Gujarat, Maharashtra, Rajasthan, New Delhi and other parts of the country participated in the Fair.

4. Shimla Book Fair (12-17 May 2012)

The Trust organised the Shimla Book Fair at the Indira Gandhi Khel Parisar, Mall Road from 12 to 17 May 2012. Shri Prem Kumar Dhumal, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Himachal Pradesh inaugurated the Fair. Prof. Peter Ronald DeSouza, Director, Indian Institute of Advanced Study, Shimla was the Guest of Honour at the function. Shri Dhumal observed, "Literature has a great impact on every person's life. Literature gives us the knowledge of history and also provides the reader an insight into the writer's experience, so that the reader can



improve his life and learn things." Several literary programmes were also organised during the Fair. Over 50 publishers and distributors participated in the Fair.

5. Nizamuddin Book Exhibition (17-19 July 2012)

Several programmes and activities were organised for children during the exhibition which included storytelling sessions and workshops.



6. Patiyali Book Fair (11-13 August 2012)

The Trust in association with Anubhuti Seva Sansthan, Patiyali organised a book fair at Patiyali, District Etah, Uttar Pradesh from 11 to 13 August 2012. The Fair was inaugurated by Smt. Kiran Yadav, eminent social worker. Shri Amit Kumar (IPS), DIG, C.B.I., New Delhi; Shri Anshuman Yadav (IPS), DIG, B.P.R.D., New Delhi; Prof. Shahid, Maulana Azad National Urdu University, Hyderabad; Shri Manoj Mishra, Court Manager, District Court, Ghaziabad; Shri Dharmendra Sachan and Shri Sudhir Tyagi, Central Excise Officers; Shri Mohit Gupta, Asst. 7. Jaipur Book Fair (8 - 14 October 2012)

Prakashak Sangh organised the Jaipur Book Fair at Amroodon Ka Bagh, Jaipur from 8 to 14 October 2012. Shri Ashok Gehlot, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Rajasthan inaugurated the Fair. He said that the significance of a printed book can never diminish, even in the present age of information technology when mobile phones and iPads carry huge amounts of data. Shri Prabhakar Shrotiya, eminent writer was the chief guest at the inaugural function. Shri Chandra Prakash Deval, distinguished scholar was the special guest. Several literary programmes were organised



during the Fair. Books on fiction, non-fiction as well as children's literature titles in Hindi, Urdu, English and Rajasthani, besides other languages including Marathi, Bangla, Konkani, etc. were exhibited. 115 publishers, booksellers, and distributors from all over the country participated in the Fair.



8. Trichy Book Fair (5-14 October 2012)

National Book Trust, India, in association with the District Administration and the Rotary Club of Tiruchirappally organised a book fair at St. John's Vestry Anglo Indian Higher Secondary School grounds, Trichy, Tamil Nadu from 5 to 14 October 2012. Ms Jayashree Muralidharan, Collector inaugurated the Fair. Shri M Thirumalai, Vice Chancellor, Tamil University, Thanjavur; Shri Su. Venkatesan, well-known writer; Shri R.S. Shanmugam, President, The Booksellers & Publishers

They appreciated NBT's initiative to organize the Fair in Trichy for the first time and hoped that it would be a regular affair. Books were available in all major Indian languages, including Hindi and English covering various genres for all age groups. The Fair was attended by a large number of people. 140 publishers, distributors and booksellers from all over India participated in the Fair.

9. Aligarh Book Fair (17-21 October 2012)

also held. 90 publishers, distributors and booksellers from all over the country participated in the Fair.

10. Bathinda Book Fair (27 October-4 November 2012)

The Fair was inaugurated by Shri Gurdial Singh, noted writer and Jnanpith award winner. Shri Baldev Singh, Sahitya Akademi Award winner and Prof. Sukhdev Singh, General Secretary, Punjabi Sahitya Akademi, Ludhiana were the special guests on the occasion. Various literary programmes were also organised during the Fair. More than 60 publishers and distributors from all over the country participated in the Fair.

11. Kozhikode Book Fair (3-11 December 2012)



The Trust in collaboration with the Kozhikode City Corporation organised the Kozhikode Book Fair from 3 to 11 December 2012. Shri M T Vasudevan Nair, Jnanpith laureate inaugurated the Fair. Ms Volga, noted Telugu writer was the chief guest at the function. Prof. A K Premajam, Mayor, Kozhikode, Shri Purushan Kadalundi, MLA, Shri K.V. Mohan, IAS, District Collector and Shri A. Sethumadhavan, Chairman, NBT also spoke on the occasion. A host of literary activities like workshops, seminars and lectures were organised during the Fair. 38 publishers

and distributors from all over the country participated in the Fair.

12. Cuttack Book Fair (15-23 December 2012)

The Trust in collaboration with the District Administration, Cuttack and Odisha Publishers & Booksellers Association, organised the Cuttack Book Fair at Baliyatra ground, Cuttack from 15 to 23 December 2012. Promotion of Indian Books Abroad

With a view to promote Indian books abroad, National Book Trust, India participates in international book fairs by displaying a cross-section of representative Indian publications brought out by various India publishers. NBT participates regularly in some of the leading books fairs which include Bologna Children's Book Fair, Colombo International Book Fair, Frankfurt International Book Fair, Sharjah International Book Fair etc.

During the year 2012-2013, NBT participated in the following international book fairs:

1. Nigeria International Book Fair (7-12 May 2012)

National Book Trust, India participated in the 11th Nigeria International Book Fair held at the Multipurpose Hall, University of Lagos, Nigeria from 7 to 12 May 2012. Over 150 publishers, booksellers and distributors from countries including India, Zimbabwe, Dubai, Ghana, Ibadan, Abuja, Turkey, Abu Dhabi, UK, and USA participated in the Fair. The NBT stall showcased more than 200 titles from India in English as well as in Hindi. Interested in knowing more about the Indian culture, the NBT stall was thronged by young and old alike. Several dignitaries including Ms Rani Malik, First Secretary at the Indian Embassy at Nigeria; Mr Samuel Kolawole, Chairman of the Mr Nigerian Book Fair Trust Fund and its Executive Secretary, Abiodun Omotubi also visited the stall.

Dr Lalit Kishore Mandora, Assistant Editor (Hindi) represented NBT at the Fair.

2. Tehran International Book Fair (2-12 May 2012)

National Book Trust, India participated in the 25th Tehran International Book Fair held at the Imam Khomeini Grand Prayer Hall, Mosaliah Ground, Iran from 2 to 12 May 2012. The Fair was inaugurated by Shri Ahmadinejad, the Hon'ble President of Iran. The TIBF is one of the biggest book events in the world where many domestic and international publishers participate. Over 2,400 Iranian publishers displayed their publications along with 1,600 international publishers from 77 countries, attracting over 5 lakh people every day.

Shri Syed Haider M. Rizvi, Manager (Sales & Marketing), NBT represented the Trust at the Fair.

3. Cape Town Book Fair (15-17 June 2012)

National Book Trust, India participated in the Cape Town Book Fair held at Cape Town International Convention Centre, Cape Town, South Africa from 15 to 17

June 2012. More than 220 books by Indian publishers were displayed at the Indian stall at the Fair. 80 local book sellers/publishers participated in the Fair. The information regarding the New Delhi World Book Fair was provided to the participating publishers at the Fair and the representatives of the countries like South Korea, Pakistan, Namibia and South Africa showed keen interest to participate in NDWBF.

Shri Anil Kumar Khanna, Assistant Director (Exh.) represented NBT at the Fair.

4. Seoul International Book Fair (20-24 June 2012)

National Book Trust, India participated in the Seoul International Book Fair held at the COEX Convention Centre, in the capital of South Korea, from 20 to 24 June 2012. Saudi Arabia was the Guest of Honour country marking 50 years of diplomatic ties with South Korea. More than 580 publishers from over 20 countries participated at the 18th edition of the Fair. National Book Trust, India put up a collective exhibit of over 200 books from India representing publications of 26 Indian publishers in different subject areas like social science, science & technology, literature, books for children, art & culture etc. Three Thematic Rights catalogues of NBT, viz. *Works on and by Mahatma Gandhi, Books on Sports*, and *Books on Cinema* were also displayed. Informative publicity cards announcing the New Delhi World Book Fair, 2013 were also distributed to the participants of the Fair. A few special exhibits were also part of the Fair of which one was dedicated to Nobel Laureates, where one of the panels focused on Gurudev Rabindranath Tagore. Out of the two halls of the Book Fair, one was completely devoted to children's books. Predominantly a Korean language market, English language books were, however, few and largely imported from UK or USA. NBT's participation in the Fair could instill in them an idea of looking for English language market of India.

Shri Kumar Vikram, Editor (English) represented NBT at the Fair.

5. Tokyo International Book Fair (5-8 July 2012) National Book Trust, India participated in the Tokyo

International Book Fair held at the Tokyo Big Sight, the international exhibition centre in Tokyo from 5 to 8 July 2012. The Fair was inaugurated by His Imperial Highness Prince Akishino, the Honorary President of TIBF. Shri Sanjay Panda, Charge d'Affairs, Ad Interim of India was also present on the occasion. Over 800 exhibitors including foreign stalls representing India, Saudi Arabia, Malaysia, Taiwan, Iran, Turkey, Italy, South Korea and USA participated. The NBT stall drew a wide spectrum



of visitors including academics, students, writers and general readers. There were varied enquiries, majority of them relating to Indian, modern literature in translation, children's literature and in a limited way, on more academic publications. Some scholars from the Tokyo University, United Nations University and others came to have a look at the latest research publications on art and religion, Indian economic development, IT and classical heritage.

Shri Binny Kurian, Assistant Editor (English) represented NBT at the Fair.

6. Nepal Education Book Fair (6 – 14 July 2012)

National Book Trust, India participated in the 16th Nepal Education & Book Fair held at Bhrikuti Mandap, Kathmandu, Nepal from 6 to 14 July 2012. Besides NBT, around 56 participants from India, Nepal and other countries like Bangladesh, Canada, U.K. etc. had participated but maximum participation was from India.

Despite continuous rainfall during all days, many visitors visited the Fair and purchased books. Biographies, books on social science, Mahatma Gandhi, collection of stories by different authors in Hindi, Children's books in English were in good demand during the Fair. The visitors were happy to find quality books at moderate prices. NBT books under NBP series in English received a good response from book lovers especially children.

Shri Dinesh Kumar, Marketing Executive and Shri Mukesh Kumar, Jr. Steno represented NBT at the Fair.

7. Colombo International Book Fair (18-26 September 2012)

The Trust participated in the Colombo International Book Fair held from 18 to 26 September 2012. Indian Books are very much in demand in Sri Lanka and the thirst for the books published exclusively in India is increasing day by day. This year also NBT books got good response from the visitors. The booklovers were eager to know about the local viability of NBT books where they can get these books in Colombo. Orders were also placed by leading Sri Lankan booksellers for NBT books. Meetings with Sri Lankan publishers were also held regarding the translation of NBT books into Singhla language.

Shri Rajeev Chaudhry, Assistant Director represented NBT at the Fair.

8. Beijing International Book Fair (29 August to 3 September 2012)

The Trust participated in the 19th Beijing International Book Fair (BIBF) held at the China International Exhibition Centre in Beijing from 29 August to 3 September 2012. The BIBF attracted over 2000 publishers and others related to book industry from over 75 countries. The Republic of Korea was the Guest of Honour country at the Fair. Digitization and emerging technology in publishing industry was the main theme at this edition of the BIBF. The Indian participation included NBT, Afro-



Asian Book Council and UBS Publishers and Distributors. NBT participated with a collective exhibit of over 150 publications representing 20 publishers from across the country.

Shri Pankaj Chaturvedi, Assistant Editor (Hindi), represented NBT at the BIBF.

9. Frankfurt Book Fair (10-14 October 2012)

National Book Trust, India participated in the Frankfurt Book Fair held from 10 to 14 October 2012. New Zealand was the Guest of Honour country at the Fair. Over 3,000 publishers, distributors from across the world participated in the Fair. An India Pavilion with 16 stalls was specially put up by NBT in association with CAPEXIL. Shri M A Sikandar, Director, NBT participated in a panel discussion



organised by the Federation of Indian Publishers in collaboration with Indian Literature Abroad, Ministry of Culture, on the sidelines of the Frankfurt Book Fair. He also attended a meeting of International Fair Directors where he discussed about the importance of participating in the New Delhi World Book Fair and how it opens up an exciting book market for Asia and Arica. Shri Taranjit Singh Sandhu, Consulate General of India at Frankfurt visited the India Pavilion and expressed his happiness at seeing a strong Indian participation. The Fair witnessed over the participation of over 3,300 professionals who

exchanged their views on new international business models and trends. More than 2,80,000 book lovers visited the Fair.

Shri M A Sikandar, Director, Shri Pradip Chhabra, Deputy Director (Exhibition) and Shri Debu Sarkar, Deputy Director (Art) represented NBT at the Fair.

10. Sharjah International Book Fair (7-17 November 2012)

The Trust participated in the Sharjah International Book Fair held at the Sharjah Expo Centre from 7 to 17 November 2012. The Fair was inaugurated by His Highness, Dr. Shaikh Sultan Bin Mohammed Al Qasimi, ruler of Sharjah. NBT participated with select contingent of Indian Publishers. Housed in a special India Pavilion, the Indian stalls witnessed a long line of visitors for trade enquiries as well as to see the hundreds of Indian books on display. Shri A Sethumadhavan, Chairman, NBT participated in an interactive session where he informed participating publishers about NBT's new Financial Assistance



Programme for translation of Indian books into foreign languages to promote Indian books abroad. Over 900 publishers from about 62 countries participated in the Fair.

The Rights Table was organised from 5 to 6 November 2012 in which over 100 publishers from across the world participated to explore interesting writings and trade in language rights. The NBT participated in the Rights Table with an exhibit of over 200 books, recently brought out in India and negotiated the rights sale on behalf of Indian Publishers. At the end of the two-day session, NBT signed interest agreements for the books *Islamic Reforms and Revival in 19 Century India* published by Yoda Press, *Dream : Mirror of the Mind* published by Bee Books and *Living Within* and the *Message of Gita* published by SABDA. Among the books published by NBT, interest agreements were signed for *Gandhi* – *A Life, Buddha for the Young, Adventures of Rusty, Random Curiosity, Beyond the Roots: Anthology of Oriya Short Stories* and *Under the Wild Sky: Anthology of Malayalam Short Stories*. The interest agreements signed for these books will also be able to get a translation grant from the SIBF.

11. Istanbul International Book Fair (17-20 November 2012)

National Book Trust, India, for the first time, participated at the Istanbul International Book Fair,

Turkey. The Fair was held at the famous TUYAP Fair and Convention Center, Beylikdüzü from 17 to 20 November 2012. Apart from India, many other countries like UK, Greece, Hungary, Germany, Russia, China, Saudi Arabia participated at the Fair. The Netherlands was the Guest of Honour Country. NBT representing the Indian publishing industry showcased more than 200 books on fiction, non-fiction, children's books, biographies, science & technology, language, general and reference books. There was a great demand and interest shown by the Turkish people and publishers on Gandhi, Tagore, yoga, science & technology and children's books.



Shri A Sethumadhavan, Chairman, NBT met Turkish publishers and shared with them details about the Financial Assistance Programme that NBT has introduced for the benefit of foreign publishers, keen on translating Indian works into their languages. He also held a meeting with Mr Kayhan Omeroglu, Director, Istanbul International Book Fair. NBT also held a series of meetings with representatives of other countries and also promoted the New Delhi World Book Fair, 2013.

Shri A Sethumadhavan, Chairman and Shri Kumar Samresh, Assistant Director (Admin.) represented NBT at the Fair.

12. Minsk International Book Fair (6-10 February 2013)

National Book Trust, India for the first time participated in the 20th Minsk International Book Fair held at the Bel Expo-exhibition ground, Minsk, Republic of Belarus from 6 to 10 February 2013. The focus of this Fair was built around the theme, 'Discover Yourself through Reading'. Russia was the Guest of Honour country at the Fair. Publishers from countries including Armenia, Azerbaijan, China, Cuba, France, Finland, Germany, Italy, Kazakistan, Turkey, United States among others participated in the Fair.

NBT was the sole publisher from India at the Fair and displayed over 200 titles in English and Hindi, all brought out by NBT. There were a lot of enquiries for books on Indian culture, philosophy, children literature and agriculture. Shri Sanjay Vyas, the First Secretary, Embassy of India in Belarus and Ms Tatsiana Bialova, Director, Belarusian Encyclopedia also visited the NBT stall.

Shri S R Veenesh, Assistant Director (Production) represented NBT at the Fair.

13. Jerusalem International Book Fair (10-15 February 2013)

National Book Trust, India participated in the 26th Jerusalem International Book Fair held at the International



Convention Center, Jerusalem from 10 to 15 February 2013. Over 150 publishers from 30 countries including France, Germany, Russia, Spain, Poland, Portugal participated in the Fair. Mr Nir Barkat, Mayor of Jerusalem inaugurated the Fair in the presence of Mr Simon Peres, President of Israel. Over one lakh books in almost all languages on varied subjects were displayed at the Fair. The Indian stall put up by the National Book Trust, India attracted many international publishers, authors and visitors. Books on medicine,

spirituality, Buddha and travelogues etc were displayed at the stall.

Shri Rubin DCruz, Assistant Editor (Malayalam) represented NBT at the Fair.

14. Bologna Children's Book Fair (25-28 March 2013)

National Book Trust, India participated in the 50th Bologna Children's Book Fair held at the City Hall, Bologna, Italy from 25 to 28 March 2013. Sweden was the guest of honour country this year. 1,200 exhibitors from 75 countries participated in the Fair. The celebrations for the golden jubilee were also marked by a week of events in the city in which thousands of children participated. In honour of the anniversary, the Bologna Fair instituted a new award: the 'Bologna Prize for the Best Children's

Publishers of the Year', to recognize excellence in children's publishing. Six prizes were awarded for six geographical areas: Europe, Asia, Africa, North America, Central-South America and Oceania, which included Tara Books, Chennai from India.

The NBT stall at the Fair attracted a number of visitors. The children's books on exhibit with colourful illustrations, lively text and attractive presentation along with low cost for wider reach appealed to many readers. Keeping in view the focus towards visibility of children's



books from India across the world, Shri M A Sikandar, Director, NBT held discussions with various publishers, illustrators and associations. In a meeting with the representatives of the International Board on Books for Young (IBBY), Shri Sikandar urged the members of the Indian chapter of IBBY to make efforts in ensuring and promoting the children's books from India at the international forum.

Shri M A Sikandar, Director and Ms Neera Jain, English Editor, represented NBT at the Fair.

Besides, the Trust also participated in the Meeting of Board of Advisors for the Asian Festival of Children's Content, China-Eurasia Publication Expo and World Hindi Conference. The details of which are as follows:

1. Advisory Board of Asian Festival of Children's Content, Singapore (29 May 2012)

Shri M A Sikandar, Director, National Book Trust, India was appointed as a member of the Board of

Advisors for the Asian Festival of Children's Content (AFCC) 2012 for two years. Representing India, Shri Sikandar attended the meeting of the Board of Advisors held in Singapore on 29 May 2012.

The countries participating in the meeting besides Singapore included Australia, Brunei, Darussalam, Hong Kong, Philippines, Indonesia, Japan, Malaysia, and Myanmar.

In his brief address, Shri Sikandar informed the members about the various activities of NBT and how, as an apex body of the Govt. of India, it spearheads the movement for promotion of books and reading in the country. He also discussed the diversity and richness of the children's publishing industry in India, not only in English but also in over 30 languages of India. In this regard, he also proposed that India may be considered as the focus country at the AFCC 2014.

Shri Sikandar also met Shri T.C.A. Raghavan, Indian High Commissioner to Singapore, where he discussed the possibilities for the promotion of Indian books in Singapore.

2. China-Eurasia Publication Expo (1-5 September 2012)

The Trust participated in the first China Eurasia Publication Expo (CEPE) held at Urumqi, Xinjiang, China from 1 to 5 September 2012. The Expo was inaugurated by Mr Hu Wei, Deputy Director of the General Administration of Press and Publication and Member of the Standing Committee of the Xinjiang Uygur Autonomous Region party Committee; and Mr Syed Mushahid Hussain, Senator, Islamic Republic of Pakistan.

The Expo was spread over in an area of 500 sq. mtr. with 55 stalls in which 11 countries including United States of America, Mongolia, Russia, Tajikistan, Armenia among others participated. A free stand to NBT was allotted where 87 titles published by NBT were displayed. The Head of the China Publishers Association and other members of the association visited the NBT stall and discussed about the Financial Assistance Programme for translating Indian books in foreign languages.

3. 9th World Hindi Conference (22-24 September 2012)

The Trust participated in the 9th World Hindi Conference held at Nelson Mandela Sabhagar at the Sandton Convention Centre in Johannesburg, South Africa from 22 to 24 September 2012. The main theme of the conference was 'Bhasha Ki Asmita Aur Hindi Ka Vaishvik Sandarbh', seeking to promote and widen the reach of Hindi language.

The conference was inaugurated

JUNDATION DAY

55th Foundation Day Celebrations



On its 55th Foundation Day on 1 August 2012, National Book Trust, India initiated an annual lecture series where an eminent personality from among women and men of letters, scholars, intellectuals and others, who have made significant contributions to the world of publishing, to reflect largely on an overarching theme of books and reading in today's India, will be invited. It is hoped that this series of lectures will extend the debate on the importance and promotion of books and reading in today's context to the public domain and bring in critical thinking.

Dr Shashi Tharoor, Hon'ble Minister of State for Human Resource Development delivered the first lecture at Constitutional Club, New Delhi on 1 August 2012. In his 45-minute address on the overarching theme of importance of books and reading in today's India, Dr Tharoor went through a whole gamut of areas on books and their influence on him. He reflected on his growth as a reader, writer and as a professional. Dr Tharoor observed that today the industry has become very competitive. He said, "We need to publish all kinds of books. For a mature publishing industry to survive, both pulp fiction which are appealing to the youth and books for discerning readers need to be given equal emphasis."

Appreciating the efforts of NBT in promoting books and creating a reading culture in the country, Dr Tharoor said, "In the last few decades, NBT's presence in book

fairs, publishing of quality books as well as its efforts in creating a reading society has been exemplary."

English today is the language of undeniable importance. A large number of writers are wielding the language in their own unique way, creating a new idiom and grammar. But whether you write in English or any other language, for Dr Tharoor, "language is only a vehicle and not a destination," which is why the work of NBT in the area of translations becomes very important.

On the occasion, Dr Shashi Tharoor released a booklet on the history of the NBT titled *National Book Trust, India: A Profile*, which captures the 55 years of long journey of NBT in its endeavour to create a climate of book reading and book buying among the large number of people in the country.

Shri Ashok Thakur, Secretary, Higher Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development, presided over the function. Shri M A Sikandar, Director, NBT also spoke on the occasion.

National Book Week

The National Book Week programme is celebrated throughout the country from 14 to 20 November every year by the Trust. Especially focused on children and young people, several book related events like seminars, panel discussions, book-release functions and book exhibitions are organised by the Trust across the country, during this Week.

Inauguration

Shri Kapil Sibal, Hon'ble Minister for Communications and Information Technology flagged off the National Book Week celebrations at Zakir Husain Delhi College, (University of Delhi) New Delhi on 14 November 2012. Shri Sibal urged children to understand the importance of books as they impart us never-ending



knowledge. He also stressed upon the need to preserve culture and tradition of the country through books in all Indian languages.

Shri Sibal also distributed NBT books worth Rs. 5,000/- to select school libraries and NGOs and merit certificates to the winners of the *Sit & Draw* competition. About 700 children, teachers and representatives from various NGOs were present on the occasion. Dr Khwaja Ekramuddin, Director, National Council for Promotion of Urdu Language (NCPUL) and Dr M Aslam Parvaiz, Principal, Zakir Husain Delhi

College was also present on the occasion.

Earlier, a *Sit & Draw* competition for children was held at the college in which around 450 students from 50 schools, educational institutions and NGOs participated in the competition.

A three-day book exhibition from 14



to 16 November, 2012 was also organised by the NBT in collaboration with Sahitya Akademi and NCPUL at the college premises. A photo gallery showcasing the journey of NBT since its foundation in 1957 was also put up at the venue.



Release of *Youth of North-East India: Demographics and Readership*

Dr M M Pallam Raju, Hon'ble Minister for Human Resource Development released a report entitled *Youth of North-East India: Demographics and Readership in correlation with Youth of Bihar and Maharashtra* at his Shastri Bhawan office, New Delhi on 20 November 2012. Shri Jitin Prasad, Hon'ble Minister of State for Human Resource Development, Shri Ashok Thakur, Secretary (Higher Education), MHRD, senior officials of MHRD, National

Council of Applied Economic Research (NCAER) and NBT were present on the occasion.

The study attempts to give an analytical and detailed account of the reading habits of literate youths in the Northeast and their exposure to different forms of media.

New Initiatives

Keeping in view the changing trends in lifestyle in the metro cities as well as small cities, the Trust this year had taken some new initiatives on experimental basis to meet the growing needs of book lovers and also to popularize books and reading habit among the masses during this special week dedicated to books.

1. Online Contest

NBT in association with Cinedarbaar organised an online contest from 16 November to 16 December 2012. This month long pan India campaign was designed to generate interest among young about books and reading and enable them to discover their writing skills.

Based on the broad theme of 'fantasy', the online contest was open for children under two categories: age-groups 6 to 12 and 13 to 17. Children under the first category participated in the 'Indian Superhero' competition, where they were asked to create an original idea of a new Indian superhero with some superpower which can be used to better India. The children in the second age-group category participated in the 'Science Fiction Story' competition, where they were asked to create a short science fiction story about aliens, time travel, robots, a futuristic world or anything 'out of the world'. Children needed to log on to www.qitaabe.com and e-mail their entries. The best entries chosen from the competition would be published in the form of a book by the National Book Trust, India.

Over 200 entries were received, out of which Cinedarbaar shortlisted a first set which had 23 in the 'Indian Superhero' category and 32 in the 'Science Fiction Story' category. The second shortlisted selection by Cinedarbaar has 10 entries from each category.

2. Qitaabé

The three-day event titled *Qitaabé* was organised in association with Cinedarbaar at the DLF Place Mall, Saket, New Delhi from 16 to 18 November 2012. The event was inaugurated by Shri M A Sikandar, Director, NBT. He said that the Trust works for children in remote and rural areas of the country to promote reading habit. However, he said that the children living in cities also need attention. Therefore, NBT has taken up some new initiatives to involve children from all segments of the society.

The activities that were held included *Treasure Hunt, Sounds and Poems, Poetree Installation, Weave a Yarn, Storytelling* session with Ms Simi Srivastava, A small library of books by National Book Trust, India and Penguin was made available at the Mall for people.



3. Promoting Books and Reading Habit through Alternative Channels

Radio, especially FM Radio, is one of the most popular media that attracts a large number of people. It not only entertains people but also provide vital information on issues concerning day to day life of common people. This year, apart from traditional publicity campaign, the Trust utilized the services of popular radio channels like FM Gold, FM Rainbow among others to reach out to book lovers across the country, promote books, create an atmosphere for reading habit and urge people to present books as gifts to their near and dear ones.

Besides, the Trust also used the social media network like Facebook to widen the campaign.

Did you face a book today? Find new friends. Outside the Social Network! Coffee conversations and a book to read! such hoardings placed at significant locations at metro stations and roads across Delhi and NCR aroused the curiosity of the young and old alike. These specially designed hoardings helped spread message that in this age of Internet, books too, are best friends.

Activities across the Country

As a part of National Book Week celebrations, NBT organised several book-related activities like seminars, book release functions, meet-the-author programmes, story writing and other competitions across the country especially in far-flung and tribal areas to promote quality books at affordable prices and habit of reading among people.

1. Andaman and Nicobar Islands

A two-day *Festival of Reading* was organised at State Library, Port Blair, Andaman and Nicobar Islands from 16-17 November 2012. The Festival was inaugurated by Dr R Dev Das, Director, Education. Dr Bhoopal Reddy, eminent Telugu author was the chief guest on the occasion.

On the first day of the festival on 16 November 2012, Readers' Club Movement, the largest children's reading promotion programme in the country being run by the National Centre for Children's Literature, was launched in Andaman and Nicobar Islands. The launch was successful as about 400 schools and libraries were enrolled as members of the Readers' Club. About 70 teachers, principals, libraries and activists were also oriented on the occasion on how to run a Readers' Club.

The second day of the Festival on 17 November featured three interactive sessions with Dr Bhoopal

Reddy, well-known author at the Govt. Sr. Sec. School (Telugu Medium), Jawaharlal Nehru Govt. College and State Library. In the first two sessions the author read out some of his works to the school children, young adults and teachers. In the third session at the State Library, apart from readings, the author also highlighted the need for regular cultural exchange between the authors of the island and mainland. The participants lauded NBT's effort in bridging the gap between people through books and book promotion activities in various parts of the country. A week-long exhibition-cum-sale of NBT publications was also organised on the occasion at the State Library from 14 to 20 November 2012.

- (c) National Book Trust, India in association with Bhai Ghanaiyaji Welfare Society and Sahitya Sabha, Pakhowal organied a Poets' Meet and a book exhibition at Master Karnail Singh Public Library, Pakhowal, Punjab on 24 November 2012. The meet was presided over by Prof. Bawa Singh, Vice Chairman, National Commission for Minorities. Dr Jaswant Singh was the chief guest on the occasion. Well-known Punjabi poets including Ms Preetpal Kaur Chahel, Shri Ravinder Bhathal, Ms Mandeep Snehi, Shri Hari Kishan Mayar, Dr Amrit Paul among others participated. A large number of people attended the programme.
- (d) A book exhibition was organised by the Trust on 23 November 2012 at Kanya Maha Vidyalaya, Jaito, Punjab. The exhibition was inaugurated by Padamshri Gurdial Singh.

10. West Bengal

The Trust in association with Bidhan Chandra College, Asansol, District Burdan, West Bengal organised literary programme at the premises of Bidhan Chandra College from 19 to 20 November 2012. The National Book Week was inaugurated by Shri Tapas Bandyopadhyaya, Hon'ble Mayor of Asansol Municipal Corporation. A poetry session with Shri R K Singh, eminent poet; a reading session on the works of Shri Sunil Gangopadhyay, eminent writer; a lecture on *Book Reading* by Prof. Ashok Sengupta, noted academician; a lecture on the topic *Literature in History* by



Shri Priyadarshi Chakrabarty, noted author; a literary meet with well-known poets, authors and critics of various Indian languages including Ms Hamida Kazi, Shri Indranath Mukherjee, Shri Mahboob Anwar, Prof. Ashok Sengupta, Shri Imtiyaz Ahmed Rashid; drawing competition for children and cultural programmes were organised during the week.

Book Exhibitions

Several book exhibitions during the week were also organised in the states of Andhra Pradesh, Andaman Nicobar Islands, Assam, Haryana, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, New Delhi, Odisha, Punjab, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, Tripura, Uttar Pradesh and, West Bengal.

Activities in North-East

National Book Trust, India, under its Development Project for North Eastern Region, a special scheme for Northeast, organised several book promotional activities in the year 2012-2013. Like the past few years, the year 2012-2013 has been an eventful and successful year for NBT as far as setting new trends in book promotional activities in the Northeast is concerned. Publishers, booksellers, authors, NGOs and the booklovers extended their help in NBT's effort of bringing all the stakeholders under one roof thereby giving a new impetus to the ever-growing reading movement in Northeast. In the process, the Trust has largely been successful in widening its readership in Northeast.

Book Fairs

In the year 2012-13, NBT organised three book fairs in Khowai, Sikkim and Nazira. Besides, NBT also participated in Barak Book Fair, Silchar (18-25 November 2012), North East Book Fair (30 December 2012 to 10 January 2013), Gangtok Book Fair (15 – 20 March 2013) and Agartala Book Fair (17 – 28 March 2013).

Khowai Book Fair (4 – 10 November 2012)

The Trust organised a book fair at Khowai Government School grounds, Khowai, Tripura from 4 to 10 November 2012. The Fair was organised in association with the District Administration, Khowai and Publishers Guild of Tripura.

Shri Aghore Debbarma, Hon'ble Minister for Tribal Welfare, Tripura inaugurated the Fair. Shri Azizul Haque, a well-known writer from Kolkata was the chief guest on the occasion. Shri Samir Deb Sarkar, Chief Whip, Tripura Legislative Assembly presided over the function. Shri Padma Kumar Debbarma, MLA (Tripura Assembly), Shri Raghunath Sarkar, President, Tripura Publishers Guild, Shri Santosh Karmakar, ADM, Khowai and Shri Sanjoy Chakraborty, SDM, Khowai were also present on the occasion. 34 publishers, booksellers and distributors participated in the Fair.

The book fair showcased 125 stalls with publishers, booksellers and distributors as participants from all over the country exhibiting and selling books on a wide array of topics for all agegroups and in all Indian languages in addition to English and Hindi.

Sikkim Book Fair (15–20 March 2013)

The Trust organised a five-day long Book Fair and *Reading Festival* at Hotel Rendezvous, Gangtok from 15 to 20 March 2013. The Fair was organised in association with the Sikkim Akademi. Shri Balmiki Prasad Singh, Hon'ble Governor of Sikkim inaugurated the Fair. The Fair sought to achieve the social objective of inculcating the habit of reading amongst the citizens, the young and the old alike.

Congratulating NBT for organizing the book fair, Shri Balmiki Prasad Singh hoped that the book fair would provide an excellent platform for interaction among authors, publishers, booksellers, book distributors, librarians, book lovers and students.

Padmashree G.S. Lama, General Secretary, Sikkim Akademi was the special guest at the inaugural function. Shri P.N.Tamang, President of Sikkim Akademi was also present on the occasion.



During the Fair, NCCL organised several programmes including a 3-day *Reading Festival*, storytelling session, creative writing workshop, drawing & painting competition and panel discussion on *Re-telling of Popular Folktales as Pleasure Reading Materials for Children* were organised. Shri P N Tamang, President, Sikkim Akademi, Shri Subhabrata Deb, Secretary, Tripura Publishers' Guild, Shri Brajeshwar Sharma, former Secretary, Authors' Forum, Manipur, Ms Sangma Lepcha, eminent author, Ms Ruchi Singh, noted author and Dr Kavita Lama, eminent academician participated in the events.

A poet's meet was also held where Shri Rajendra Bhandhari, Shri Kapil Adhikari, Shri Praveen Khaling, Bheem Rawat, Shri Binasri Kharel and others rendered their poems to a packed audience.

Children from various local schools including Devrali Government School, Tasi Namgayal Academy, Daffodils School and others participated with enthusiasm and showcased their talent. The young winners of all competitions were given away prizes on the last day of the Fair.

About 15 publishers, booksellers and distributors from all over the country displayed some of their latest publications. The NBT stall visited by many book lovers, exhibited a wide range of books in Hindi, English and other Indian languages.



Nazira Book Fair (23–31 March 2013)

The Trust organised a book fair at the Nazira Gandhi Maidan, Nazira, Assam from 23 to 31 March 2013. The Fair was organised in association with the civil administration of Nazira and Probah, an NGO. Inaugurating the first Book Fair of the town of Nazira, Shri Imran Shah, President, Asom Sahitya Sabha expressed his happiness and commended NBT's efforts. Others who were present at the inaugural function included Dr Hemoprobha Saikia, chairperson, Assam Tourism Development

Corporation, Shri P.K. Das, SDO, Shri Debobrat Saikia, President All Assam Publishers and Booksellers Association, among others.

The major attractions at the book fair were the several seminars, panel discussions, literary programmes



and cultural events held for children and general public. Various competitions were also held for students and the winners were given away prizes.

In a seminar on the topic *Talking Books Linking Minds*, Shri Sandip Phukan, senior journalist, NDTV said, "Indian culture is a book culture and our society carries a great book reading tradition since the ancient

Vedic period." He added that regular reading habit, constant scrutiny and active social sense is the feedback for success of all media persons and general people as well.

Workshop on Science Translation (9 – 11 November 2012)

National Book Trust, India organised a workshop on *Disseminating Science: A Workshop on Science Translation* in association with Assam Science Writers Association at Hotel Maple Leaf, North Lakhimpur, Assam from 9 to 11 November 2012.

The workshop, with around 40 budding science writers from all over Assam, was inaugurated by Dr Anwar Uddin Choudhury, IAS, Deputy Commissioner, Lakhimpur District and an acclaimed ornithologist. While narrating his experience in attending several international science symposia elsewhere in the world, he said that we must not be apologetic over dominance of English language in



science literature. But to ensure easy access to science literature we must translate those in regional language, he said. Saying that there is a difference between a book written by an expert and that by an author, he urged science publishers, NBT included, to be extremely careful in selecting their authors.



Earlier, welcoming the participants, Dr Amiya Rajbongshi, former General Secretary of All India Science Teachers Association, gave a brief account of the initiative taken by the Assam Science Writers Association in enriching the Popular Science writings in Asamiya and inculcating scientific temper among the people in general and the youth in particular.

Dr Dinesh Chandra Goswami, renowned science fiction writer, translator and editor and Prof Kshiradhar Barua, former President of Assam Science Society and co-

editor of Science Encyclopaedia in Asamiya were the Resource Persons of the workshop.

The workshop discussed in detail the technical nuances of science translation. The workshop also witnessed lively sessions on Asamiya equivalents of scientific terminologies, importance of context and syntax in Asamiya language.

Training Course in Book Publishing, Guwahati (14 – 22 March 2013)

The Trust in collaboration with the All Assam Publishers and Booksellers Association organised the Training Course in Book Publishing in Guwahati, Assam from 14 to 22 March 2013. The course was inaugurated by Shri Hemanga Kishore Sarma, Commissioner Higher Education, Government of Assam. Other dignitaries who graced the occasion included Shri Naba Thakuria, Secretary, Guwahati Press Club and Shri Ajit Kumar Burman, President, All Assam Publishers and Booksellers Association. The course aimed to give the participants an overview of publishing. Hands-on experience practical and interactive sessions formed an important segment of the course.

Mobile Book Exhibitions

With active help from the local administration and intelligentsia, NBT organised the following *Pustak Parikrama* (Mobile book Exhibition) in Northeast during which books were made accessible to the readers in various remote areas of the region.

Activities in Jammu and Kashmir

National Book Trust, India has been organizing book fairs, mobile exhibitions and other book-related activities like panel discussions, book release functions, seminars etc across the country to promote book mindedness among people, especially among youth and making low-cost books available to book lovers. To further this objective and keeping in mind the ever-growing demands of the book lovers of Jammu & Kashmir, NBT has been organizing such activities in the region for last many years.

Book Fairs

In the year 2012-13, NBT organised Srinagar Book Fair (2-10 June 2012) and Leh Book Exhibition (4-9 August 2012).

Srinagar Book Fair (2-10 June 2012)

The Trust organised the Srinagar Book Fair after a gap of 20 years at Sri Pratap College grounds, Srinagar from 2 to 10 June 2012. The Fair was organised in collaboration with the J & K Academy for Art, Culture and Languages and the Jammu and Kashmir Urdu Academy.

The Fair was inaugurated by Shri Omar Abdullah, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Jammu



& Kashmir. He said, "Srinagar Book Fair is a welcome step in the direction of reviving the habit of book reading among the people of the state."

The Fair provided an opportunity to the students and scholars of the valley to explore the world of books. Much appreciated, the Fair attracted people from all walks of life including cabinet ministers and other political leaders of state like Finance Minister Mr. Abdul Rahim Rather, J&K Legislative Council Dy. Chairman Shri M. Y. Taing Syed Ali Geelani, Mirwaiz Umar Farooq and Muhammad Yasin Malik. Appreciating the efforts of NBT to bring books to the valley, they observed that the



youth of J & K must grab the opportunity of visiting the Fair and buy books. According to them, reading is an important aspect of life and helps to create a better tomorrow.

Literary programmes that drew a large number of visitors to the Fair included interactive sessions organised by NCCL, between writers like Prof. Manoj Das and Ghulam Nabi Aatash and students, Mehfil-e-ghazal, panel discussions and seminars. A Writer's Meet organised by Sahitya Akademi and NBT presided over by Prof. Muhammad Zaman Azurda, emphasised on the promotion of Kashmiri language. Another interesting discussion that took place was a seminar on the master



storyteller Saadat Hassan Manto by the J & K Academy of Art, Culture and Language. The event was presided over by Prof. Hamidi Kashmiri, noted writer and former Vice Chancellor of Kashmir University.

About 112 publishers in 177 stalls spread over the ground displayed a large number of books on various subjects.

Leh Book Exhibition (4-9 August 2012)



The Trust organised the first book exhibition in Leh in Ladakh region of Jammu & Kashmir at Polo Ground, Leh from 4–9 August 2012. The Fair was organised in collaboration with Leh District Administration.

Inaugurating the Exhibition, Shri Rigzin Spalbar, Chief Executive Councillor, Ladakh Autonomous Hill Development Council (LAHDC) said, "I welcome the first ever exhibition of books by NBT in Leh. This is a very good initiative which will not only popularise book reading among Ladakhis but would also strengthen national integration."

While appreciating the efforts of NBT and the importance of organising the book exhibition in the

region, Shri Spalbar also highlighted the problems faced by parents to encourage reading among children due to nonavailability of books. They have to travel to cities like Jammu, Srinagar, Chandigarh and Delhi to buy books.

Others who spoke on the occasion included Shri Ghulam Abbas Abidi, Executive Councillor for Higher Education and Shri Abdul Ghani Sheikh, eminent writer.

Besides NBT, NCERT too participated at the Exhibition with a strong display of its publications. Hundreds of visitors from in around Leh visited the Exhibition.



With the Himalayan mountain ranges at the backdrop, the Leh Book Exhibition was a very successful initiative on the part of the Trust to take books to such remote region.

Activities by National Centre for Children's Literature

The National Centre for Children's Literature (NCCL) was established in 1993 by the Government of India as a part of NBT to monitor, coordinate, plan and aid the publication of children's literature in various Indian languages. Besides developing a Library-cum-Documentation Centre of children's literature, the Centre is engaged in organizing seminars, workshops and exhibitions, and also, is actively promoting the habit of reading at school level by encouraging the setting up of Readers' Clubs. During the year under review, over 1,000 Readers' Clubs were established across the country.

The activities undertaken by NCCL during the financial year 2012-13 were as follows:

Seminars, Workshops, Orientations etc to promote Children's Literature

 On the occasion of World Book and Copyright Day, a week-long *Festival of Children's Content* was organised at Future Foundation School, Regent Park, Kolkata from 23 to 28 April 2012. The Festival was organised in collaboration with Publishers' and Booksellers' Guild, Kolkata and the Future Foundation School of Sri Aurobindo Institute of Culture. Shri Sabyasachi



Chakraborty, eminent actor and wildlife photographer inaugurated the Festival. Shri Tridib Chatterjee, General Secretary, Publishers' and Booksellers' Guild presided over the programme. Various programmes including a 2-day creative writing and illustration workshop, interactive session with the famous author Paro Anand, workshop on *How to Review a Book*, panel discussion on the topic *Bangla Children's Literature Today* and workshop on *Poster Design* with Priya Nagarajan eminent illustrator as the resource person were organised. More than 5,000 children and young adults from various schools of Kolkata took part in this Festival.

2. An orientation on Readers' Club Movement was organised at the Municipal Corporation Primary School, Subhash Nagar, New Delhi on 26 April 2012. The programme was organised in collaboration with Room to Read. Principals from

50 government primary schools of Delhi participated in the programme. Ms. Chander Kiran, Programme Officer, Room to Read, presented a vote of thanks on the occasion.

- 3. An orientation on Readers' Club Movement was organised at Puredelia in Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh on 30 May 2012. About 150 education officers, principals, teachers and librarians participated in the programme. Shri Hemant Kumar, eminent author and lecturer, SIET was the resource person of the programme. Shri Ajay Vikram Singh, Block Education Officer, Puredelia also spoke on the occasion.
- 4. An orientation on Readers' Club Movement was organised at District Institute of Education and Training (DIET), Una, Himachal Pradesh on 12 June 2012. About 70 professionals related to education including Deputy Directors of District Primary Education and Higher Education and the Principal of DIET participated in the programme. 7. Over 200 children drawn from various schools, including MCD primary schools, MCD Pratibha Vidyalaya, Delhi Public School, Vasundhara & Ghaziabad; Shri Ram School, Gurgaon and those associated with NGOs such as Agha Khan Foundation and Sakshi participated in the workshop.

8. A panel discussion on the topic *Telling Tales to Children* was held at Pragati Maidan, New Delhi on 5 September 2012. The discussion was organised in collaboration with Federation of Indian Publishers. - 9. A 2-day National Seminar on Promoting Reading among Children was organised in association with Department of Human Development and Family Studies, The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda at Vadodara, Gujarat from 16 to 17 October 2012. The seminar was inaugurated by Prof. Yogesh Singh, Vice-Chancellor of the University. Dr. Subodh Mahanti, Director, Vigyan Prasar presented the keynote address on the occasion. Several eminent scholars, writers, academicians from various parts of the country participated in the Seminar.
- 10. The first ever 2-day Children's Literary Festival in the state of Himachal Pradesh was organised in association with Consortium Octet Sahitya Akademi and District Administration at a remote village, Polian Purohita, Una, Himachal Pradesh from 27 to 28 October 2012. Reading sessions, discussion on Reviving Rural Literature, story-writing workshops etc were organised during the Festival. Renowned authors including Dr Pratyush Guleri, Dr Neeta Sarkar, Dr Som Nath Dixit, Dr Raman Sharma among others participated in these events.
- 11. A 2-day illustration workshop was organised in collaboration with Brij Bhushan Memorial Society at Ferozabad, Uttar Pradesh from 8 to 9 December 2012. Around 60 young girls participated in the workshop. The workshop was conducted by Shri Durga Dutt Pandey, noted artist. A session on book review and an exhibition of books was also organised on the occasion.
- 12. A 2-day workshop on creative writing and illustration was organised in collaboration with Vijayawada Book Festival Society at Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh from 8 to 9 January 2013. The workshop was inaugurated by Dr N Mangadevi, noted author and activist for children. Shri D Ashok Kumar, Member of Telugu Advisory Panel of NBT presided over the function. Smt. Swati Shripada, eminent children's author in Telugu, Shri Siddharth Ramanuj, eminent illustrator from Gujarat, and Ms M. Krishna

- (b) 767 newly acquired books have been digitalised for the users during the period under review.

4. Documentation

- (a) Library updates its members about the latest news, events, activities, additions in the library, enewsletters and journals in the field.
- (b) A list of renowned authors and translators of children's literature in all Indian languages is being compiled under the project *Makers of Indian Children Content*. During the year 2012-13, NCCL received the details of 600 contemporary children's writers and translators in Indian languages.

5. Library Committee Meeting

During the period under review following Library Committee meetings were held:

- (a) A meeting regarding *Makers of Indian Children's Content* and Holding List of NCCL library was held on 3 October 2012.
- (b) A meeting regarding selection of books for display during New Delhi World Book Fair, 2013 was held on 22 January 2013.

Sales & Marketing

The Trust publishes moderately priced books for all segments of the society and for all age groups in Hindi, English and all major Indian languages. The Trust organizes various book exhibitions, book fairs and mobile book exhibitions through specially designed mobile exhibition vans to ensure the availability of the Trust's publications across the country, especially in remote areas, and small & medium towns. The NBT books are also being sold from its bookshops located at HQs, Vasant Kunj, CCIC Janpath, Asaf Ali Road in New Delhi and at its Regional Offices in Bengaluru, Kolkata and Mumbai. The Trust has developed an excellent network of its authorized book sellers as Agents and Distributors throughout the country and during the year it has added 98 new book sellers.

The Trust has also started receiving orders online and accordingly supplying the orders placed by individuals and organizations/institutions.

Our Book Club Scheme is also playing a major role in promotion of the sale of books and reading habit. 8,102 new Book Club members have been enrolled during the year 2012-13.

The Mobile Book Exhibition programme (*Pustak Parikrama*) is another important mode for the sale promotion of books and reading habit. The Trust has conducted 35 such *Pustak Parikaramas* throughout the country thereby covering 1,571 Exhibition points, especially in the remote areas. The gross sale generated is Rs. 67.67 lakh from these exhibitions. It is indeed our great pleasure that the Trust has generated gross sale of Rs. 3,592.59 lakh and revenue generated from the sale of books has been Rs. 1,974.73 lakh.

National Book Trust, India Financial Assistance Programme (NBT FAP)

In order to promote and pursue translations of Indian books into foreign languages,

the Trust initiated a financial assistance programme to foreign publishers. The programme will provide suitable incentive in the form of financial assistance to foreign publishers for translation of original Indian writings published by Indian publishers in English, Hindi and other Indian languages into foreign languages.



The programme covers broad categories of fiction, non-fiction, science and technology and books for children, except dictionaries, magazines, journals, text books for schools/colleges and professional courses like medicine, engineering, pure & applied sciences and business administration.

In order to give particular focus on writings in Indian languages where an English translation is not available, and to promote such writings abroad, the NBT would facilitate its translation into English, and in such areas the NBT would bear 50% of the translation fee. Open to foreign publishers, the programme has elicited a lot of interest among a cross section of publishers both from India and abroad.

Within a short period of time the programme received a lot of enquiries. Among which proposals from Italy and China are under consideration. Besides during the year, the Trust has been able to negotiate successfully the sale of Rights of two of its books for Chinese language translation.

As part of this programme, the Trust for the first time organised a Rights Table Forum for publishers during the New Delhi World Book Fair, 2013. The New Delhi Rights Table was a two day event that brought together publishers, rights-agents and editors from India and abroad to network and explore business opportunities together. Organised as B2B match making sessions, it enabled the participants to book their own Rights Table, meet and present their products and ideas.

A successful initiative, the New Delhi Rights Table was a major attraction at the New Delhi World Book Fair. It attracted over 60 publishers from India and abroad. Besides, major publishers from across India, foreign participants included publishers from UK, Malaysia, Thailand and USA.

Training Course in Book Publishing

National Book Trust, India organizes Training Course in Book Publishing across the country to help participants take up publishing as a career. The Training Course focuses on various aspects of publishing like developing manuscripts, editorial process, production and marketing of books, techniques of translation, export of books, Copyright and other legal issues of publishing, sale of Rights, export of books etc. Members of the faculty drawn from leading universities, institutions and publishing houses give an insight into publishing industry to the participants through interactive sessions.

In its endeavour to meet the growing demand of printing industry for professional manpower and help students pursue career in publishing, the Trust has signed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the University of Calcutta on 19 June 2012 and Ambedkar University, Delhi on 14 December 2012 for starting book publishing courses.

During the Financial Year 2012-2013, four publishing courses in Goa, New Delhi, Bengaluru and Guwahati were organised by the Trust.

Training Course in Book Publishing, New Delhi (2 – 28 July 2012)

The Trust organised the four-week long Training Course in Book Publishing at Nehru Bhawan, New Delhi from 2 to 28 July 2012. The course was inaugurated by Shri R S Mathrani, IAAS, Director General Audit. Shri Manas Saikia, MD, Cambridge University Press was the guest speaker at the function. This year, 35 participants from various parts of the country enrolled for the course. Some of the participants were sent for internship to different publishing houses. Eminent professionals from the publishing industry interacted with the participants during the course.

Training Course in Book Publishing, Goa (1 - 13 October 2012)

The Trust organised a two-week Training Course in Book Publishing in Goa from

1 to 13 October, 2012. The course was organised in collaboration with Krishnadas Shama Goa State Central Library, Directorate of Art & Culture, Patto, Panaji and Konkani Akademi, Panaji. The course was inaugurated by Shri Vishnu Surya Wagh, MLA and Chairman, Kala Academy, Sanskruti Bhavan. Shri Wagh is also an eminent writer and dramatist. Shri Pundalik



Narayan Nayak, Chairman, Konkani Akademi, Shri Sridhar Balan, Consultant, Ratna Sagar Publishers and Shri Carlos M Farnandes, Curator, Krishnadas Shama Goa State Central Library were the speakers on the occasion.

Training Course in Book Publishing, Bengaluru (19 November to 1 December 2012)

The Trust in collaboration with the Karnataka Rajya Vignana Parishat, Kannada Book Authority, Kannada Sahithya Parishat and Bangalore Booksellers and Publishers Association organised the Training Course in Book Publishing in Bengaluru, Karnataka from 19 November to 1 December 2012. This was the first-ever publishing course organised by the Trust in Bengaluru. The course was inaugurated by Dr Sumatheendra Nadig, well-known writer and former Chairman of NBT. The two-week long course was attended by about 45 participants. The valedictory function was organised on 1 December 2012. Dr. Siddalingaiah, President, Kannada Book Authority was the chief guest on the occasion.

The detail of Training Course held in Guwahati, Assam has been provided in the *Activities in North-east* section of the Annual Report.

Assistance for Publication of Books

Financial assistance is provided by the Trust under its Subsidy Scheme for publication of books.

Scheme for the Subsidized Publication of Books

Through this Subsidy Scheme, the NBT promotes publication of reasonably priced books for students and teachers of Indian universities and technical institutes by providing royalty to authors and financial assistance to publishers for bringing out books which could serve as textbooks, discipline-oriented reference material or reference books.

During the period under review, one title was published under the Scheme and the total amount of subsidy given was Rs.11,70,751.00.

Schedule-21—SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. ACCOUNTING CONVENTION

The financial statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention, unless otherwise stated and on the accrual method of accounting.

2. INVENTORY VALUATION

Raw material and finished goods are valued at lower of cost and net realizable value.

3. INVESTMENTS

- 3.1 Investments classified as "long term investments" are carried at cost.
- 3.2 Investments classified as "Current" are carried at lower of cost and fair value. Provision for shortfall in the value of such investments is made for each investment considered individually and not on a global basis.
- 3.3 Cost includes acquisition expenses like brokerage, transfer stamps.

4. FIXED ASSETS

Fixed Assets are stated at cost of acquisition inclusive of inward freight, duties and taxes and incidental and direct expenses related to acquisition.

5. **DEPERCIATION**

- 5.1 Depreciation is provided on Written Down Value Method as per rates specified in the Income Tax Act 1961 and as per Income Tax Rules 1962 as amended from time to time.
- 5.2 In respect of additions to/deductions from Fixed Assets during the year, Depreciation is considered on pro-rata basis.
- 5.3 Assets costing ₹ 5000.00 each or less are fully provided.

6. ACCOUNTING FOR SALES

Sales are net of Sales Returns, Rebate and Trade Discount.

7. GOVERNMENT GRANTS / SUBSIDIES

- 7.1 Government grants of the nature of contribution towards capital cost of setting up projects are treated as Capital Reserve.
- 7.2 Government grants are accounted on realization basis.

8. FOREIGN CURRENCY TRANSACTIONS

Transactions denominated in foreign currency are accounted at the exchange rate prevailing on the date of the transaction.

9. LEASE

Lease rentals are expensed with reference to Lease terms.

10. RETIREMENT BENEFITS

- 10.1 The Trust regulates payment of Pension as per the Rules laid down under CCS (Pension) Rules. Actuarial Liability towards Pension upto the year end has worked out to ₹38112545/-
- 10.2 Liability towards Gratuity payable on death/retirement of employees is accrued based on actuarial valuation at ₹7736054/- upto the year end.
- 10.3 Actuarial Liability for accumulated Leave Encashment benefit to the employees is accrued and computed on the assumption that employees are entitled to receive the benefits and has been estimated at ₹ 4144485/- as at the year-end.

11. REVENUE RECOGNITION

Revenue is recognized only when the books have been dispatched from NBT Godowns and the purchaser has become legally liable to pay.

12. ACCOUNTING FOR ANNUAL MAINTENANCE CONTRACTS

Annual Maintenance Contracts are accounted for at the time of making actual payment.

13. GENERAL PROVIDENT FUND ACCOUNT

General Provident Fund Account is not merged in the main Account. However, a set of the Account is annexed for reference.

14. ACCOUNTING FOR ROYALTY PAYMENTS

The Trust publishes books in various languages and under various series. As per the approved policy of Royalty, the Trust pays 50% of the total Royalty due to the Author immediately on publication of a title. This payment is treated as an Advance Royalty and is adjusted against the Royalty accruing annually to the Author against sale in the subsequent years. After this advance is fully adjusted against Sales Royalty, the balance 50% Royalty is released based on the annual quantum of sale of the title.

1. CURRENT ASSETS, LOANS AND ADVANCES

In the opinion of the Management, the Current Assets, Loans and Advances have a value of realization in the ordinary course of business, equal at least to the aggregate amount shown in the Balance Sheet.

2. TAXATION

In view of there being no taxable income under Income Tax Act, 1961, no provision for Income Tax has been considered necessary.

3. ESTABLISHMENT EXPENSES

The Establishment Expenses as per Receipts & Payments Account are ₹ 1899.79 lakh as compared to previous year amount of ₹ 1613.29 lakh i.e. an increase of 17.76% which is a routine rise. However, the amount in Income and Expenditure A/c has worked out to ₹ 1803.81 lakh as against ₹ 1673.64 lakh of previous year and has marked an increase of 7.78% in routine course.

4. PUBLISHING EXPENSES

The Publishing expenditure for the current financial year is ₹ 1104.32 lakh as against ₹ 1304.37 lakh of previous year. Publishing expenditure is directly linked with sale of Trust's publications.

5. PHYSICAL VERIFICATION OF FIXED ASSETS

Physical verification of Fixed Assets has been conducted during the year and no discrepancies were noticed.

- 6. Physical verification of stock of books as on 01.04.2012 was conducted under the supervision of NBT Officials and a shortage of ₹ 63,50,769.00 was noticed. The same has been adjusted during the year 2012 -2013 with the approval of Finance Committee and Executive Committee.
- 7. A Civil Suit no. 4595 for ₹ 1,14,46,313/- including value of books for ₹ 35,10,500/- has been filed before District City Court, Mumbai in the year 2006 against Municipal Corporation, Mumbai. Judgement is still awaited.
- **8.** Corresponding figures for the previous year have been re-grouped and re-arranged wherever necessary.
- **9.** Schedule 1 to 22 are annexed to and form an integral part of the Balance Sheet as at 31 March 2013 and the Income and Expenditure Account for the year ended on that date.
