Introduction

The National Book Trust, India is an apex body established by the Government of India in the year 1957 for the promotion of books and developing reading habit in the country.

Publishing

Publishing forms a major activity of the Trust. It publishes a wide variety of reasonably priced quality books ranging from works of fiction to books on Medical Sciences and cutting edge technology for all segments of the society and for all age groups, including a wide variety of illustrated books for children. Over the years, the Trust's determined efforts in developing a strong and inclusive policy towards publishing is also apparent in the variety of books published for visually handicapped and the neo-literates.

The Trust publishes books in all major Indian languages, which includes Asamiya, Bangla, English, Gujarati, Hindi, Kannada, Kashmiri, Malayalam, Manipuri, Maithili, Marathi, Nepali, Odia, Punjabi, Sindhi, Tamil, Telugu and Urdu. In addition to this, the Trust has also published books in Ao Naga, Bhojpuri, Bhili, Bhatri, Halbi, Himachali, Kokborok, Khasi, Garo, Lepcha, Bhutia, Mising, Limboo, Mizo, Newari, Bodo, among others.

During the period under review 1,555 titles were published by the Trust. These included 152 originals, 182 translations, 1,210 reprints and 11 revised editions.

New Initiatives

As a part of its efforts to promote books and reading habit across the country and abroad, the Trust undertook some new initiatives during the financial year 2013-14. Some of the major new initiatives include:

National Book Trust, India has stepped up its effort to promote reading habit and provide platform to book lovers to organize book promotional

events through its Book Promotion Centres in major capital cities of the country. As a part of this initiative, the Book Promotion Centre was opened in Guwahati on 15 March 2014. The Trust has also planned to open Book Promotion Centres in Agartala, Chennai, Hyderabad, Kochi and Patna.

To tap young commuters of metro trains and encourage them to read books while travelling, National Book Trust, India has entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Delhi Metro Rail Corporation (DMRC) on 23 October 2013. As part of this agreement, the Trust will open bookshops at major metro stations in New Delhi and will promote reading habit through visual publicity material like posters etc. The bookshops at the Kashmere Gate and Vishwavidyalaya metro stations have become operational.

During the New Delhi World Book Fair 2014, the Trust undertook a unique initiative—Kidz Bubble, a dedicated space with four corners for fun and creative activities for children. The four corners remained a hub of activities during the Fair where everyday hundreds of children participated in activities like storytelling, extempore speech, singing competition, listening skill activities, thread painting, leaf painting, collage-making, wax resist painting, mosaic painting, waste recycling crafts, origami, leaf craft, waste recycling crafts, clay toys, drawing competition, etc.

For the first time in New Delhi World Book Fair, a radio station was put up by the National Book Trust, India in association with 92.7 Big FM. A make-shift studio was installed at Pragati Maidan where the events being organized at the Fair were covered and special



guests and visitors were interviewed. The presentation provided a unique experience for the listeners as the radio presentation was a blend of entertainment, music and information.

Book Promotion Activities

The Trust organises Book Fairs/Exhibitions throughout the country. The NBT is the organizer of the prestigious annual

New Delhi World Book Fair. NBT has so far organised 22 New Delhi World Book Fairs, 39 National Book Fairs and more than 215 Regional Books Fairs.





Book Fairs in India

During the period from April 2013 to March 2014, the Trust organised nine Book Fairs across the country including Amdayad National Book

Fair (1 - 7 May 2013); Dharamshala Book Fair (8 - 13 May 2013); Kanyakumari Book Fair (19 - 28 July 2013); Moga Book Fair (28 September - 6 October 2013); Chandigarh Book Fair (13 - 18 November 2013); Mumbai Book Fair (29 November - 3 December 2013); Hyderabad Book Fair (7-15 December 2013); Mangalore Book Fair (4-12 January 2014) and Ramanathapuram Book Fair (25 January - 2 February 2014).

The Trust also stepped-up its book promotional activities in the Northeast through a number of Book Fairs, literary activities and special sales drive. During the year under review, the Trust organised a literary programme and book exhibition in Gangtok and set up its Book Promotion Centre in Guwahati, Besides, the Trust also organised special exhibits of the Trust's publications at various colleges and universities in the region.

The Trust has also broadened its activities in Jammu & Kashmir to create book-mindedness and make NBT books available to the people in the valley. During the year under review, the Trust organized a panel discussion on the topic *Kashmiri Language and Literature* in Jammu, Shiksha Shivir in Kathua, Training Course in Book Publishing in Srinagar and mobile exhibitions.

International Book Fairs

In order to promote Indian publishing abroad, the Trust participates in various International Books Fairs by displaying a cross section of representative Indian publications brought out by various Indian publishers. Since 1970, the Trust has participated in more than 330 International Book Fairs. During the period under review the Trust participated in 14 such International Book Fairs, including the prestigious London Book Fair (15 - 17 April 2013); Abu Dhabi International Book Fair (24 - 29 April 2013); Kuala Lumpur International Book Fair (26 April - 5 May 2013); Tehran International Book Fair (1 - 11 May 2013); Warsaw International Book Fair (16-19 May 2013); Nepal Education Book Fair (24 May-1 June 2013); Seoul International Book Fair (19 - 23 June 2013); Colombo International Book Fair (14 - 22 September 2013); Beijing International Book Fair (28 August - 1 September 2013); Frankfurt Book Fair (9 - 13 October 2013); Sharjah International Book (6 - 16 November 2013); and Bologna Children's Book Fair (24 - 27 March 2014).

Besides, the Trust also participated in the Asian Festival of Children's Content (AFCC) held in Singapore from 25 to 30 May 2013 and attended a meeting with SAARC Cultural Centre, Colombo, Srilanka held from 19 to 21 August 2013.

Mobile Exhibitions

The Trust has been trying to make the books available to the people at their doorsteps through mobile exhibitions. So far it has organised more than 13,000 Mobile Exhibitions throughout the country including the Northeastern states. During the period under report, the Trust organised Mobile Book Exhibitions at about 1,650 places in and around Bihar, Goa,

Gujarat, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, Jharkhand, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Nagaland, New Delhi, Punjab, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand and West Bengal.

Financial Assistance Programmes

The Ministry of Human Resource Development had entrusted the scheme of Financial Assistance to Voluntary/Private organisations for organising Seminars/Training Courses/Workshops/Annual Conventions/Book Fairs related to the Book Promotional Activities to the Trust. A number of organisations had applied for financial assistance for organising various Book Promotional Activities. Grants were released to 271 organisations during 2013-14 by the Trust to meet 75% of the approved expenditure of such Book Fairs, Seminars, etc.

Besides, the Trust also provides assistance to authors and publishers for the publication of reasonably priced university level text and reference books and for books on Medical Science under its Subsidy Scheme. During the year under review, two titles were published under this scheme.

Literary Activities

The Trust organises several book-related activities for the development of the publishing industry of the country. It organises workshops and seminars for those involved in the development, production and distribution of books. It also organises author's meet and other literary activities such as book release functions from time to time. During the period under review, over 100 activities were organised by the Trust.

National Centre for Children's Literature (NCCL)

The Trust also has a National Centre for Children's Literature (NCCL), which is the nodal agency to monitor, coordinate, plan and aid the publication of children's literature in various Indian languages. The NCCL has developed a library-cum-documentation centre of children's literature. It organises workshops, seminars and exhibitions to develop the children's literature of the country. With a view to promote and develop the reading habit of the children at the school level, the NCCL encourages setting up of Readers' Clubs at the schools throughout the country and also conducts surveys and takes up research work relating to children's literature. So far, over 35,000 Readers Clubs have been set up across the country. During the period under review, the NCCL established 1,000 Readers Clubs, besides organising







meet-the-author programmes, story-telling sessions, workshops, seminars Readers Club Orientation programmes and other children's activities in various parts of the country. In addition, 12 monthly issues of Readers' Club Bulletin, a bilingual magazine for promotion of reading habit among children were also brought out.

Language Advisory Panel Meetings

To guide and support its publishing programme in various Indian languages under different series, the Trust constitutes advisory panel for each language from time to time. The panel comprises of eminent authors, scholars, translators, academicians, publishers and professionals in the field of publishing. During the year 2013-14, four advisory panel meetings were held including Gujarati Advisory Panel Meeting in New Delhi on 24 September 2013; Advisory Committee Meeting on Nehru Bal Pustakalaya Series in New Delhi on 25 September 2013; Marathi Advisory Panel Meeting at Mumbai University on 30 November 2013 and Asamiya Advisory Panel Meeting on 15 March 2014.

Book Promotional Activities by the NBT Regional Offices

Besides the Northern Regional Office at its headquarters, the Trust also has three Regional Offices at Bengaluru, Mumbai and Kolkata. The regional offices are primarily responsible for the marketing and sales of NBT publications. The regional offices also participate in various Book Fairs organised both by the Trust and other agencies throughout the country. The regional offices also organise NBT book exhibitions at various places in their respective regions. The regional offices are also responsible for enlisting distributors and agents for the sale of NBT publications. During the period under report, 51 new agents/distributors were enrolled. It also enrolled 4,962 new Book Club members.

National Book Week

Every year during the National Book Week from 14-20 November, the Trust organises a number of book promotional activities throughout the country to promote book mindedness among the masses. This year National Book Week was celebrated far more extensively, some new initiatives were taken and a special attention was given to tribal and remote areas of the country like Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Odisha among others. The celebration saw a large number of children from various schools and NGOs across the country. NBT also organized book exhibitions throughout the country. Besides, a number of book promotional activities, which included seminars, book review sessions, meet-the-author programmes, poets' meet and book release functions were held all over the country.

Training Courses in Book Publishing

The Trust also organises short term Training Courses in Book Publishing in various parts of the country with the objective to create a talent pool of trained professionals for the publishing industry. While a four-week Training Course in Book Publishing at Delhi has become an annual feature, it also conducts short-term training courses of one-to-two week duration in

other parts of the country. During the period under report, apart from four-week Training Course in New Delhi, one short-term publishing course was held in Srinagar.

Financial Performance

During the year beginning April 2013 to March 2014, the Trust achieved net sales of Rs. 1,672.43 lakh. The revenue earned during this period was to the tune of Rs. 1,707.10 lakh.

Publishing

The NBT provides a wide variety of books for all age groups and on all subjects keeping in view the needs of its readers and demands of a fluctuating market. A brief note on the various series and on the number of books published under each series during 2013–2014 is as follows:

Aadan Pradan

Aadan Pradan is a series of particular importance because of its unique potential for forging national integration through the exchange of creative literature of the different regions. It presents well-known literary works, mainly novels, short stories, anthologies of popular poetry and reminiscences, of a particular language, to people of other Indian languages.

A total of 118 titles were published under the series during the year including 20 originals, 25 translations and 73 reprints. Of these, 3 were in Asamiya, 7 in Bangla, 2 in English, 35 in Hindi, 2 in Kannada, 11 in Marathi, 1 in Konkani, 1 in Gujarati, 23 in Punjabi, 5 in Odiya, 2 in Tamil and 27 in Urdu. Significant titles include Blood & Soil, Kashti aur Bareta, Dashami Dibase, Aur Kathayen Aisi Bhi, Binapani Mohantinca Shrestha Galpa.

Nehru Bal Pustakalaya

The Nehru Bal Pustakalaya series aims at creating a treasure-house of enjoyable and informative literature which children can read at their own initiative. It also promotes national integration by providing common reading material on a wide range of subjects in their mother tongue to children all over India. Books of this series cater to four age groups: pre-school, 6–8, 9–11 and 12–14. Illustrations material for these books is commissioned separately and all books carry colour and / or black & white illustrations, line drawings and photographs. In the case of books for pre-school children, the text, if any, revolves around multi-coloured pictures which tell a story by themselves.

During the year, 573 titles were published under the series. These include 30 originals, 94 translations and 449 reprints. The language-wise break-up is as follows: Asamiya: 37, Bangla: 56, English: 162, Hindi: 163, Marathi: 46, Odia: 10, Punjabi: 16, Telugu: 13, Kannada: 3, Tamil: 4, Bhatri: 1, Malayalam: 1, Bhili: 11, Halbi: 8, Kashmiri: 6 and Urdu: 36. Significant titles include *Galpe Prithvi Vraman*, *Gift of God, Greet When You Meet, Space Shuttle, Budha Gharial, Chiti Pompur.*

India — The Land and the People

Books in this series introduce the varied physical environment, the diverse cultural traditions and the flora and fauna have enriched the composite and colourful character of India. These books, written in a non-technical, lucid style by subject experts, provide authentic and up-to-date information on the subject.

100 titles were published during the year comprising 2 originals, 5 translations and 92 reprints. These include 11 in Asamiya, 7 in Bangla, 41 in English, 23 in Hindi, 2 in Gujarati, 2 in Odia, 7 in Urdu and 6 in Marathi. Significant titles published include *Ratna Meemans*, *Sajawati Paththron ka Sansaar, Bengali Theatre, Traditional Indian Theatre*.

Popular Science

This series aims at enabling the average educated reader to understand the world around them appreciate the progress of science, and learn about the role science and technology play in everyday life, emphasizing, wherever possible, India's contribution to the field. The books in this series are written in a lucid, easy-to-understand, simple style and illustrated with anecdotes and analogies from daily life. Diagrams, sketches and photographs elucidate the text.

120 titles were published during the year, including 7 originals, 10 translations, 102 reprints and 1 revised edition. The language-wise editions include 16 in Asamiya, 6 in Bangla, 50 in English, 27 in Hindi, 2 in Kannada, 10 in Marathi, 1 in Boro, 1 in Odia, 6 in Urdu and 1 in Punjabi. New titles published were *Paribesh O Janaswasthe Arsenic O Flu, Who...., From a Doctor's Diary, Swastharakshak Chikitsa, Dil Ek Anmol Ratan.*

Young India Library

The main objective of publishing books under the *Young India Library* series for young readers of the $18 \pm$ age-group is to introduce the social, economic and political concepts, issues and choices which will control them in the years to come. Stories of adventure and travel, and books on career opportunities are also included in this series.

60 titles were published during the year, including 7 originals, 1 translation, and 52 reprints. Language-wise break-up of the titles is as follows: 5 in Asamiya, 5 in Bangla, 21 in English,

16 in Hindi, 2 in Kannada, 6 in Marathi and 4 in Urdu. Significant titles among these are A Simple Life of Swami Vivekanand, Sri Ratna & Kim Suro, Women Who Inspired Me, Jayza Jaadu Jagat ka..

Folklore

The *Folklore* series enables the readers of one region to get acquainted with folklore which had shaped the cultural identity of those living in other regions of the country. Descriptions of the area, people, myths, mythology, religion, customs, traditions, fairs and festivals, music, dance, drama, art & craft, and folk literature are also included in the books of this series.

21 titles were published during the year, including 2 originals and 19 reprints. Of these 2 were in English, 1 in Bangla, 15 in Hindi, 1 in Asamese, 1 in Bhojpuri and 1 in Odia. Significant titles include *Bastar ka Adivasi Evam Lok Sangeet, Himachal ke Lok Geet*.

National Biography

The objective of the *National Biography* series is to bring out biographies of Indian women and men who have made outstanding contribution towards the development of Indian society, culture, science, economy, polity as also of modern Indian sensibility. These provide an authentic, objective, comprehensive and analytic account of the person's life and times.

Under this series, 133 titles were published during the year. These include 10 originals, 11 translations, 108 reprints and 4 revised editions. The language-wise break-up is as follows, Asamiya: 11, Bangla: 6, English: 15, Hindi: 34, Marathi: 29, Punjabi: 5, Kannada: 10, Odiya: 1, Tamil: 2, Gujarati: 1, Urdu: 19 and Telugu: 2. Significant titles include *Rameshwari Nehru*, *Motilal Nehru*, *Shyamacharan Shukla*, *Nanak Singh*, *Bhapa Pritam Singh*: *Jiwan Yatra*.

Autobiography

This series comprises autobiographies of distinguished social, political and literary figures of India, whose contributions have made the country proud.

During the year, 5 titles were published, including 4 translations and 1 reprint. Of these, 1 were in Hindi and 2 each in Bangla and Punjabi. Significant titles include *Mohit Sen, Maut Ke Intezar Mein*.

Creative Learning Series

The objective of this series is to bring out books on new educations concepts and tools that are now being actively implemented in the pre-primary and primary sectors of education. With an orientation towards a practical mode of approach, these books are specially designed keeping in view the needs of teaches and others working in the field of education.

During the year, 32 titles were published under the series. These include 3 originals,

2 translations and 27 reprints. Language-wise break-up is: 2 in Bangla, 5 in English, 1 in Gujarati, 16 in Hindi, 3 in Kannada, 2 in Marathi, and 4 in Urdu. Significant titles include *Kahani Ki Kala, Activity Based Learning Science, The Good Books Guide.*

Popular Social Science

The books under this series introduce popular concepts and ideas of social sciences to the general reader. A variety of emerging subject areas like gender studies, tribal studies, peace and conflict studies, development economics, social formation, etc. are the major focus of the series.

70 titles were published under this series. These included 8 originals, 12 translations and 48 reprints, of which 3 in Bangla, 21 in English, 21 in Hindi, 9 in Marathi, 2 in Punjabi, 1 in Tamil, 3 in Gujarati, 1 in Kannada 1 in Odia and 1 in Urdu. Significant titles include *Living with Hunger, India's Security in a Turbulent World. Khap Panchayat, Punjab de Khanabadosh Kabile*

Books for the Neo-literates

Most books published under the series are the outcome of workshops organized in rural areas with the participation of local people. To make these relevant to the needs of the neo-literates, the books are written in an idiom familiar to them and are field-tested. Short stories, biographies, novelettes, folktales, presentations of contemporary issues and functionally useful information are brought out in a style which attracts neo-literates to read at their own initiative.

Under this series, 153 titles were published during the year, comprising 18 originals, 7 translations, 1 revised edition and 127 reprints. These include: 11 in Bangla, 3 in Kannada, 104 in Hindi, 6 in Asamese, 4 in Kashmiri, 12 in Urdu and 2 in Mararthi. Significant titles include *Bairang Lifafa, Budiya ki Pothi, Chithiyan, Kheni : Ek Zehar.*

Classics

Since only contemporary works are published under *Aadan Pradan* series, Classical Indian Literature is brought out under this series.

During the year, 4 titles were reprinted of which 1 original and 3 reprints. 3 in Punjabi and 1 in Urdu, namely *Sheikh Farid Rachna Siddhantika Ate It, Rangbhoomi, Sevasadan*.

Popular Readers Series

In addressing the needs of contemporary readers, this new series of books brings to focus some of the recent debates and discourse in many fields of enquiry like science, art, history, film, translation, literature, etc. Keeping in view the ethical and political dimensions, the books also discuss the importance and role of the discipline in today's times, with an emphasis on the Indian context.

The series started with the publishing of 2 original titles and 1 reprint. 3 in English in the year under review, namely *What is Mathematics?*

General Series

Significant titles which cannot be covered under the above series are published as *General* titles. Books published under this series provide an in-depth study of the subject and also serve as authentic reference material.

During the year, 83 titles were published, including 16 originals, 7 translations, 2 revised editions and 57 reprints. Language-wise break-up of the titles is as follows: 1 in Asamiya, 19 in English, 33 in Hindi, 5 in Marathi, 5 in Bangla, 6 in Kannada, 3 in Odia, 6 in Urdu and 5 in Punjabi. Among the significant titles published include *Rabindranather Pragati Bhavana*, *Flowerwoods Hotel, Komagata Maru: Not Just a Voyage, Brihad Samantar Kosh, Kavi Ka Kaha.*

Continuing Education Series

The objective of this series is to bring out books for the participants of Continuing Education Programme in all major languages of India. Books in this series include collection of freedom songs, books on Indian culture, polity, industry, agriculture etc. Besides, the series also comprises biographies and major novels of Indian literature abridged for target readership.

Under this series, 24 titles were published this year, of which 2 was originals, 1 was translation and 20 were reprints. Language-wise break-up is: 1 in Asamiya, 3 in Bangla, 7 in Hindi, 7 in Marathi, 1 in Punjabi and 4 in Urdu. Significant titles include *Rashtranirman ke Teen Tata Sapoot, Gajar Ghas ki Kahani, Lal Bahadur Shastri*.

Asian / Pacific Co-publication Programme

This is a novel attempt under the aegis of UNESCO, at developing books for Asian children by Asian authors. To have children in Korea share their fantasies with their counterparts in Sri Lanka is probably no mean achievement. And when Indian and Pakistani editors work as part of a team to build a list of children in the 20 odd countries of the continent we inhabit, it is a great new beginning. These books are steps for bridging minds and creating a common heritage for this vast continent and are the very best of Asia today.

During the year, 10 titles were published under the series of which 10 were reprints. These included 4 in English, 1 in Hindi, 2 in Bangla, 1 in Odia and 1 in Urdu, 2 in Marathi. Significant titles include *Read Me a Story*, *The Wall and Other Stories* and *Laughing Together*.

Indian Diaspora Studies

The books under this series seek to bring out the salient features of the impact of

cross-cultural interaction, alienation and exile, displacement, immigration, etc. on various knowledge systems like literature, sociology, culture, philosophy, etc. Emerging as a significant field of study, NBT's foray into this area of publishing is a pioneering effort.

During the year under review, one reprint Hindi title was published in the series. The title being *On the Other Side of Midnight*.

World Literature Series

Select novels and anthologies of contemporary writings from the Asian, African and Latin American countries are included in this series.

Under this series, six titles were published, which included 3 originals, 2 translations and 1 reprint. The language wise 2 in English, 1 in Marathi, 1 in Odia and 1 in Tamil. Significant titles included, *Mirrored Images : An Anthology of Sri Lankan Poetry, Chini Chashni, Hot Days Long Nights*.

Golden Jubilee Series

During the Golden Jubilee Year of the Trust in 2007, a series of special anthologies of Post Independence writings in various Indian languages were initiated.

During the year under review, two reprint anthologies were reprinted in Urdu namely *Urdu Drama Ka Safar, Azadi ke Baad, Wadi-e-Khayal.*

Indian Literature Series

Books under this series present works of well-known writers in their respective languages. These include novels, short stories, plays, and essays.

Under this series, 39 titles were published, which included 20 originals, 2 translations and 17 reprints.

The language wise 30 in Hindi, 2 in Punjabi, 1 in Telugu and 6 in Urdu. Significant titles included *Hindi ki Pramukh Vyangyan Lekhikayen, Ramakant Sankalit Kahaniyan, P. Yashodha Reddy Uthama Kathalu, Guldan & Other Stories.*

NEW DELHI WORLD BOOK FAIR, 2014

The Trust organised the annual New Delhi World Book Fair, 2014 from 15 to 23 February 2014 at Pragati Maidan, New Delhi. The Fair was organised in association with the India Trade Promotion Organisation (ITPO).

Shri Pranab Mukherjee, Hon'ble President of India inaugurated the New Delhi World Book Fair, 2014. The President appreciated the New Delhi World Book Fair 2014 as a manifestation and celebration of a liberal, democratic, multilingual, multicultural and secular society. The President said that the "NDWBF has played the twin role of cultural and business admirably," and added "No human society can develop in all its dimensions without books. They carry the wisdom of generations. Book fairs are a source of multiple inspirations and remind us that history and tradition have celebrated the argumentative India and not an intolerant India."








Chairman and Dr M A Sikandar, Director, NBT were also present on the occasion.

More than 1000 publishers, booksellers and distributors participated in the Fair including foreign participants from 26 countries including France, Iran, Japan, Nepal, Poland, Pakistan, Singapore, Sri Lanka, South Korea and Saudi Arabia. In addition, international bodies such as the World Bank, WHO and UNESCO also participated in the event.

The Theme Presentation: This year, the theme of the Fair was *Kathasagara: Celebrating Children's Literature*. The Theme Pavilion was inaugurated by Shri Ashok Thakur, Hon'ble Secretary, Higher Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development. On the occasion, he also released two catalogues published by NBT titled *A Tale of Tales* which provides a glimpse on various forms of Indian children's literature; and *Children's Books 2014: An Annotated Catalogue of Select Children's Books in India* in which about 800 books in English, Hindi and all Indian languages have been detailed. Shri A Sethumadhavan, Chairman, NBT, Ms Veena Ish, Joint Secretary, Book Promotion, Ministry of HRD, and Dr M A Sikandar, Director, NBT were also present.

A number of panel discussions, workshops, counselling sessions for young adults, storytelling sessions and interactive sessions with eminent children's authors and

illustrators like Ruskin Bond, Abid Surti, Paro Anand, Kshama Sharma, Nina Sabnani etc were organised in the Theme Pavilion in Hall No. 7E to promote books, creativity and the habit of reading especially amongst children. The presentation also included collective exhibit of about 800 books on various aspects of children's literature in Indian languages and a special exhibit *A Tale of Tales* of 150 panels providing an insight into varied forms of Indian children's literature like folk tales, epics, classics, storytelling tradition and depicting the growth of Indian children's literature till modern times.

Shankar Revisited: To mark the birth centenary of Shankar Pillai, the legendary children's writer, illustrator and founder of Children's Book Trust, a special commemorative corner was put up in the Theme Pavilion.

Harekrishna Devsare and Pulak Biswas Retrospectives: The Theme Pavilion paid homage to Dr. Harekrishna Devsare and Shri Pulak Biswas. Dr Devsare was the editor of *Paraag*, popular children's magazine and had authored more than 300 books. Shri Pulak Biswas was one of the prominent illustrators of our country who had supported NBT's efforts in bringing out books in the Nehru Bal Pustakalya series.

Illustrators' Corner: The corner featured works of eminent illustrators of India like Mickey Patel, Atanu Roy, Jeyanthi Manokaran, Ravi Paranjape among others.

Guest of Honour Presentation: Poland was the Guest of Honour country at the New Delhi World Book Fair, 2014. Besides the high-level officials related to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Ministry of Culture, the delegation consisted of the galaxy of publishers, writers, rights managers, academicians, translators including Ms Olga Tokarczuk, writer, bestselling author, Mr Jacek Dehnel, writer, Ms Magdalena Dêbowska, CEO of Polish Rights Agency, Mr. Michal Nogas, journalist, Polish National Radio, Mrs Magdalena Heydel, lecturer, Mr Michal Rusinek, writer, Mr Wojciech Jagielski, writer, Ms Malgorzata Gurowska, illustrator and graphic artist, Ms Monika Browarczyk, Ms Maria Skakuj Puri, both being translators from Polish to Hindi.

During the nine days of the Fair, the Polish Pavilion hosted a number of talks and discussions on Polish book market and publishing, Polish literary genres, fiction, readings from the works of Polish Nobel laureates, Polish school of posters, comparative dialogues, best of Polish illustrations for children reflected today's Poland in all its vibrant diversity. These included, 'Impact of the Polish School of Posters on Illustrated Books for Children', 'Feminist Travellers: Myth or Reality', 'Workshop for Children', 'An Exploration of Polish Poetics', 'The Literary Heritage of Krakow and Delhi', 'Polish-Hindi Translations and Literary Exchange', 'Interaction between Indian & Polish Authors', besides the launch of Hindi translations of popular Polish titles. A special exhibit of around 100 Polish books by different publishers was also put up at the Pavilion.

Desaj: The Festival of Tribal and Folk Performing Arts of India was inaugurated by Ms Leela Samson, Chairperson, Sangeet Natak Akademi. Shri A Sethumadhavan, Chairman, NBT and Shri Sonam Tshering Lepcha, Padma Shri awardee was also present on the occasion. The Festival was organised in collaboration with the Sangeet Natak Akademi and Sahitya Kala Parishad. Folk artists from across the country performed various art forms representing different States of India like Gond Tribal Dance (Andhra Pradesh), Hirni Birni Katha (Bihar), Chhattisgarhi Folk Music, Ghoomar, Phag, Dhamal and Loor (Haryana), Baha and Sarpha Dance (Jharkhand), Singari Melam (Kerala), Swang (Madhya Pradesh), Hill Music of Manipur, Manipuri Folk Dance, Mayurbhant Chhau (Odisha), Singari Dance and Chutkuchuta Nritya (Odisha), Gidda and Bhangra (Punjab), Songs by Langa and Manganiyar Children (Rajasthan), Lepcha Music (Sikkim), Fakiri Songs (West Bengal), among others.

Special Features

Authors' Corners – In the year 2013, the Trust successfully introduced the concept of Author's, Corner at New Delhi World Book Fair where eminent authors and other literary personalities had reading sessions and interacted with the book lovers. This year too, the Fair had four Author's Corners namely *Reflections, Conversations, Lekhak Manch* and *Sahitya Manch* where scores of writers and academics both established and aspiring, read from their works and entered into lively debates with the visitors. These included: Karan Singh, Deepti Naval, Ruskin Bond, Vikas Swaroop, Taj Hassan, Michael Fischman, Sudeep Nagarkar, Kishlay Bhattacharjee, Mamta Kalia, Manager Pandey, Ashok Vajpeyi, Rattan Singh, Anupama Chopra, Vinod Nair, Rajiva Wijesinha, Sonal Kalra, Joginder Singh, Rashmi Bansal, Vesna Jacob, Shekhar Trivedi, Amrinder Bajaj, MK Raina, Shombit Sengupta, Yashodhara Lal, Anna Vetticad, Mushirul Hassan, Hindol Sengupta, Dr Parthasarathy, among others.

Literary Events – The Trust also facilitated other publishers and organisations to hold their literary events in three auditoriums located at Hall No. 14 & Hall No. 18. About 100 literary activities such as seminars, discussions and book release functions were held during the Fair.

New Initiatives

Kidz Bubble: A unique initiative, Kidz Bubble — a small enclave for very young children at the New Delhi World Book Fair 2014, was the place for them to unleash their creativity. The Kidz Bubble had a Centre Stage and four corners—Art and Craft by Macaw Books, Fun Corner by Society for All Round Development (SARD), and a Creative Corner by NBT. Throughout the nine days of the Fair, the Kidz Bubble was packed with activities like storytelling, extempore speech, singing competition, listening skill activities, thread painting, leaf painting, collage-making, wax resist painting, mosaic painting, waste recycling crafts, papier mache, origami, leaf craft, waste recycling crafts, clay toys, drawing

competition, paper folding, string puppets, paper toys, finger puppets, flower making, and so much more. Every day hundreds of children from various schools participated in these activities. Inaugurating the Kidz Bubble on 15 February 2014, Ms Rita Menon, CMD, ITPO said that it was the best place for young children to have fun and take them into their own world of fun, wonder and imagination.

WBF Live — For the book lovers, NBT in association with 92.7 Big FM, installed a make-shift radio station at the Fair and covered the events in the Fair, everyday.

B2B Activities during New Delhi World Book Fair, 2014

CEOSpeak over Chairman's Breakfast – NBT in association with FCCI organised CEOSpeak over Chairman's Breakfast on 16 February 2014. The CEOSpeak was inaugurated by Dr. Narendra Jadhav, Member, Planning Commission, Government of India. The key speakers on the occasion were Ms. Beata Stasinska, Vice President, Foksal Publishing Group, Poland, Mr. R. Ramachandaran, Executive Director, National Book Development Council of Singapore and Executive Secretary, Asian Festival of Children's Content (AFCC) among others. Initiated last year as a part of the New Delhi World Book Fair, this edition of CEOSpeak, aimed to bring greater interaction with the publishing community in India and establish a forum of CEOs to discuss and share business and book-trade related issues and concerns. Nearly 100-120 CEOs, MDs, Directors, and other Senior Executives from the publishing industry participated in the event.

New Delhi Rights Table – The New Delhi Rights Table, a two-day B2B session for publishers, translators, editors and rights agents from India and abroad was organised at Lounge 1, Pragati Maidan to establish network and explore business opportunities. It offered B2B match making sessions between publishers to book their own Rights Table, meet each other, present their products and tentatively finalize their interests and agreements for transfer of translations and other subsidiary rights of books available in English, Hindi and other Indian languages. Shri A Sethumadhavan, Chairman, NBT, Dr M A Sikandar, Director, NBT, Ms Magda Hadal, translator from Poland, Ms Magdalena Debowska, a Rights agent from Poland among others were present on the occasion.

They discussed how theatre inspires children to read good books.

- 37. An illustration workshop by Ms. Malgorzata Gurowska and book reading session by Ms Seema Anand for children was organised at the Polish Pavilion at Hall No 7 on 20 February 2014.
- 38. A storytelling session *A Morning with Jeeva Aunty* in association with Pratham Books was organised in the Theme Pavilion on 21 February 2014. Ms Jeeva Raghunath, the well-known storyteller interacted with the children in her distinctive style and left the audience spell bound.
- 39. A panel discussion on the topic *Need for Classroom Libraries* was organised in association with Pag-e in the Theme Pavilion on 21 February 2014. The speakers on the occasion were Shri Arvind Kumar, Ms Zakia, Ms Sangeeta Chaudhry and Ms Ruchika Mehra. The speakers discussed about the need to develop school libraries in rural and remote areas of the country to make good books available to the children.
- 40. An interactive session *NBT Express: A Journey to the World of Children's Literature* in association with Consortium Octet was organised in the Theme Pavilion on 21 February 2014. Dr Shekhar Sarkar, author interacted with the children and asked them questions related to Indian literature. A play on the importance of education titled *Janna Zaroori Hai* was presented by the artists of the Kala Sankraman and an interactive session with Ms Jeeva Raghunath, noted author and Shri Orjit Sen, eminent illustrator was also organised at the Theme Pavilion.
- 41. The Trust organised a *Young Writers' Meet* in association with Sahitya Akademi at Sahitya Manch in Hall 8 on 21 February 2014. Young authors and poets representing different languages including Sanjib Paul Deka (Asamiya), Sanwal Dhami (Punjabi), Rati Agnihotri (Hindi & English), Chongtham Dipu Singh (Asamiya), Tasneef Haider (Urdu) read out their works to a packed hall.
- 42. A panel discussion on the topic *Children's Literature and Education* was organised in association with Bachpan Society in the Theme Pavilion on 22 February 2014. Dr Madhu Pant, Ms Surekha Panandiker, Dr Usha Sharma, Ms Shashi Jain and Ms Vidya were the speakers on the occasion. They

discussed about inculcating reading habit in children by making educational tools interesting at the school level.

- 43. A counselling session on the topic *Relieving Stress for Children and Young Adults* was organised in association with the Department of Adult Continuing Education and Extension, University of Delhi in the Theme Pavilion on 22 February 2014. The session was conducted by Ms Aditi Sarkar.
- 44. A puppet show on *Red Riding Hood* and a play on *Meet Mr Zero* was organised in association with Children's Creative Club in the Theme Pavilion on 22 February 2014. The children from Mewat, Haryana performed in these shows.
- 45. A presentation on *Indian Folk Tradition* in association with Navratan Foundation was organised in the Theme Pavilion on 22 February 2014. The children dressed up in colourful traditional dresses performed folk dance from across the country like *Kathakali*, *Haryanvi* folk dance, *Bihu*, *Bhangra*, *Lavini* etc.
- 46. An interactive session with Ms Nina Sabnani, noted illustrator and Shri Ankit Chadha, renowned author was organised in the Theme Pavilion on 22 February 2014. The other activities that were organised at the Pavilion included a skit titled *Ladkiyon Ko Kyon Padna Chahiye* by MCD School, Raghubir Nagar, New Delhi, a play on *Bano Insaan* by Sawan Kripal Ruhani Mission and a play on *Importance of Books* by children of Katha.
- 47. A panel discussion on the topic *Aaj Ka Drama* was organised by National Book Trust, India at Sahitya Manch in Hall No. 8 on 22 February 2014. Renowned playwrights Shahid Anwar, Danish Iqubal, K S Rajendran and Anees Azami shared their views.
- 48. An informal gathering of the visiting Polish authors, artists and officials of Book Institute, Poland with some Indian authors, artists and editors was organised at the Polish Pavilion on 22 February 2014. Shri A. Sethumadhavan, Chairman, NBT, Ms. Anna Tryc-Bromley, Director, Polish Institute, Jacek Dehnel, young Polish poet, Malgorzata Gurowska, an artist, Asad Zaidi (Hindi), Subir Roy (Artist), Dr Akram Khurshid (Urdu), Soumitra Dasgupta (Artist), Nilakshi Borgohain (Assamiya), Kusumlata Singh (Hindi), Dr Bhagyalaxmi (Telugu-English), Prof. J L Reddy (Telugu), Prof. Inde (Punjabi), Amrit Jyoti Mahanta (Assamiya-English) and Dr M A Sikandar, Director, NBT were the speakers on the occasion.

He talked about the reading habit of the youth and inspired them to read more and more books in all languages. On this occasion, Shri A Sethumadhvan, Chairman, NBT announced that the New Delhi World Book Fair, 2015 would be held from 14-22 February 2015. Ms Rita Menon, Chairman & Managing Director, ITPO and H.E. Piotr Klodkowski, Ambassador of the Republic of Poland also spoke on the occasion.
- 51. In the session titled *Bahadur Bacchon ki Kahani*, Shri Harish Chandra Mehra, the first National Bravery Award Winner and Ms Mahika Gupta, the recipient of the National Bravery Award, 2013 interacted with the audience on 23 February 2014. BOOK FAIRS

With the objective of promoting book culture in the country, National Book Trust, India organizes book fairs/exhibitions throughout the country at the regional and national level.

During the period from April 2013 to March 2014, the Trust organised the following book fairs in different parts of the country including New Delhi World Book Fair, 2014.

1. Amdavad National Book Fair (1 - 7 May 2013)

The second Amdavad National Book Fair was organised from 1 to 7 May 2013 at Gujarat University Convention Centre. The Fair was organised by Amdavad Municipal Corporation in association with National Book Trust, India with the support of Gujarat Sahitya Parishad and Gujarat Prakashak Mandal. Shri Narendra Modi, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Gujarat, inaugurated the Fair. He emphasised on the importance of reading and spoke at length about how technology can make a major difference in popularising books. He spoke about how book fair represents a collective effort and strength to make books more popular. Shri Bhagawati Kumar Sharma, eminent Gujarati writer, was the Chief Guest at the function, while Shri Asit Vora, Mayor was the Guest of Honour. Dr M A Sikandar, Director, NBT was the special guest at the function.







2. Dharamshala Book Fair (8 - 13 May 2013)

The trust Organised the Dharamshala Book Fair at Police Ground, Dharamshala, Himachal Pradesh from 8-13 May, 2013. The fair was organised in association with the District Adminatration, Dharamshala. Shri C Palrasu, Deputy Commissioner of Kangra inaugurated the fair. A large number of the students, authors, scholars, journalists and people from all walks of life visited the Fair. About 50 publishers and distributors from across the country participated in the Fair. Several workshops, discussions and cultural programmes were organised during the Fair.

3. Kanyakumari Book Fair (19 - 28 July 2013)

The Trust organised the Kanyakumari Book Fair at the S.L.P. School Grounds, Nagercoil from 19 to 28 July 2013. The Fair was organised in collaboration with the District Administration, Kanyakumari. With over 50 publishers displaying a wide range of books in Punjabi, Hindi, English and Urdu, spread over 60 stalls, the Moga Book Fair saw a steady stream of book lovers, students, teachers, librarians, media persons and celebrities visiting the Fair grounds.

5. Chandigarh Book Fair (13 - 18 November 2013)

The Trust and Union Territory Administration, Chandigarh organised the Chandigarh Book Fair at the Parade Grounds, Sector 17, Chandigarh from 13 to 18 November 2013. Shri Shivraj V Patil, Hon'ble Governor of Punjab and Administrator, UT of Chandigarh inaugurated the Fair. Several workshops, discussions, interactive sessions and cultural programmes were organised during the Fair. The legendary athlete Shri Milkha Singh, Dr Surjit Patar, renowned poet, Ms Tara Deshpande, noted author, Shri Keki N Daruwallah, eminent poet, Shri Sachin Garg, noted author among others visited the Fair.

6. Mumbai Book Fair (29 November - 3 December 2013)

The Trust organised the Mumbai Book Fair at MMRDA Grounds, Bandra-Kundla Complex, Mumbai from 29 November to 3 December 2013. Shri Balchandre Nemade, eminent Marathi poet, novelist and critic and Sahitya Akademi awardee inaugurated the Fair. Shri Satish Kalsekar, Marathi poet and editor was the Guest of Honour. The function was presided over by Shri A Sethumadhavan, Chairman, NBT. Dr M A Sikandar, Director, NBT was also present on the occasion. 50 publishers from across the country participated at the Fair. Many literary programmes including poetry reading sessions were organised during the Fair.

7. Hyderabad Book Fair (7 - 15 December 2013)

The Trust organised the Hyderabad Book Fair from 7 to 15 December 2013. The Fair was organised in association with Hyderabad Book Festival Society. Shri E.S.L. Narsimhan, Hon'ble Governor of Andhra Pradesh inaugurated the Fair. Ms Jeelani Bano, well known Urdu writer, Shri K Srinivas, poet and editor and Ms Vibha Bharti, Secretary, Hyderabad Book Festival Society spoke on the occasion. With around 400 participants it was one of the biggest book fairs organized in Hyderabad. Many literary programmes and special activities for children were organised during the Fair.

8. Mangalore Book Fair (4 - 12 January 2014)

The Trust organised the Mangalore Book Fair at the Football Ground, Mangalore from 4 to 12 January 2014. The Fair was organised in collaboration with Konkani Language and Cultural Foundation (KLCF), Mangalore. Shri B Ramanath Rai, Hon'ble Minister for Forest and Environment, Government of Karnataka inaugurated the Fair. 45 publishers and booksellers from all over the country participated in the Fair. Several literary and cultural programmes were organized during the Fair.

9. Ramanathapuram Book Fair (25 January - 2 February 2014)

The Trust organised the Ramanathapuram Book Fair from 25 January to 2 February 2014. The Fair was organised in association with District Administration, Ramanathapuram. It was the first ever book fair organised by the Trust in the city. Shri S Sundarraj, Hon'ble Minister for Handlooms and Textiles, Government of Tamil Nadu inuagurated the Fair. He stressed on the importance of cultivating the reading habit from a very young age and insisted parents should buy books like any other gifts they buy for festivals. Revenue Officer; and Shri Mayilvahanan, IPS, Dist. Suptd. of Police. Many authors and dignitaries visited the Fair and interacted with the booklovers. Prominent among the dignitaries included Dr A P J Abdul Kalam, former President of India.



PROMOTION OF INDIAN **BOOKS ABROAD**

With a view to promote Indian books abroad, National Book Trust, India participates in international book fairs by exhibiting a cross-section of representative Indian publications brought out by various India publishers. NBT participates regularly in some of the leading books fairs which include Bologna Children's Book Fair, Colombo International Book Fair, Frankfurt International Book Fair, Sharjah International Book Fair etc.

During the year 2013-2014, NBT participated in the following international book fairs:

1. London Book Fair (15 - 17 April 2013)

National Book Trust, India participated in the 42nd London Book Fair held at the Earls Court, London from 15 to 17 April 2013. This year the Market Focus programme celebrated Turkey in all its colours. Turkey's exciting and varied culture, arts and literature was the toast of the Fair. Indian contingent was represented by over 35 publishers and printers including some well known and leading organisations. About 20 Indian exhibitors including NBT were housed at the India Pavilion. Shri J Bhagwati, India's High Commissioner to UK inaugurated the India







Pavilion. The Trust participated with over 300 books from a cross section of publishers from across the country. NBT stall facilitated a large number of visitors with the exciting range of books that India had to offer in English, Hindi and other Indian languages. *Books from India: A Rights Catalogue* brought out on the occasion provided details of the books published recently in India across various genres and languages. Shri A Sethumadhavan, Chairman, NBT held a series of meetings with foreign publishers and Rights agents and informed them about NBT's recent initiative of providing financial assistance to foreign publishers keen on translating Indian works into foreign languages.

Shri A Sethumadhavan, Chairman and Shri Binny Kurian, Assistant Editor (English) represented NBT at the Fair.

2. Abu Dhabi International Book Fair (24 - 29 April 2013)

National Book Trust, India participated in the Abu Dhabi International Book Fair held at the Abu Dhabi National Exhibition Centre, Abu Dhabi from 24 to 29 April 2013. The Fair was inaugurated by His Excellency Sheikh Sultan bin Tahoom Al Nahyan, Chairman of the Abu Dhabi Tourism and Culture Authority. Over 1000 exhibitors from 51 countries with about 5,00,000 books in 30 languages participated at the Fair. About 12 publishers including NBT represented India at the Fair. The focus of the Fair was on publishing in Gulf countries and digital publishing. In a Publishers'Meet organised in association with Embassy of India, Abu Dhabi, at the NBT stall, Dr M A Sikandar, Director, NBT said, "We are stepping up our activities to promote Indian books in this market." He further added that, "for the first time we are selling our books through a local collaborator, M/s Book Land, Abu Dhabi. In this way, we will be reaching out to a large group of readers in need of NBT books." Ms Amiya Chakravarty, Second Secretary (Culture), Embassy of India, Abu Dhabi, and H.E. Sheikh Al Jumma, Director, Abu Dhabi International Book Fair along with a large group of publishers participated in the programme.

Dr M A Sikandar, Director and Shri Imranul Haque, Dy. Director (Sales) represented NBT at the Fair.

3. Kuala Lumpur International Book Fair (26 April - 5 May 2013)

National Book Trust, India participated in the 32nd Kuala Lumpur International Book Fair held at the Putra World Trade Centre, Kuala Lumpur from 26 April to 5 May 2013. The Fair was inaugurated on 27 April 2013 by Mr. YB Dato'Saifuddin bin Abdullah, Deputy Minister of Higher Education, Malaysia. Saudi Arabia was the guest of honour country this year. With more than 700 participants and about a million visitors, the theme of Fair this year was: 'Books: Generating Creative Intelligence.' The stall of the National Book Trust, India was placed in the International Pavilion. Visitors were happy to see the range of various genres of Indian publishing. The popular science and children's books of NBT were a favourite

with the visitors. Shri Vinesh Kumar Kalra, Second Secretary at the Indian High Commission at Kuala Lumpur visited NBT stall and appreciated the variety of books exhibited.

Shri Sumit Bhattacharjee, Asst. Director (Training & Projects) represented NBT at the Fair.

4. Tehran International Book Fair (1 - 11 May 2013)

National Book Trust, India participated in the 26th Tehran International Book Fair held at the Imam Khomeini Grand Prayer Hall, Mosaliah Ground, Iran from 1 to 11 May 2013. The Fair was inaugurated on 30 April 2013, by the Hon'ble President Mahmood Ahmadinejad and Minister of Culture and Islamic Guidance Mohammad Hosseini. Over 2,545 Iranian and 1,600 international publishers participated in the Fair spread over a space of 1,20,000 square meters. Foreign publishers from 77 countries such as Germany, India, Syria, Saudi Arabia, Britain, Lebanon and United States among others participated.

Shri Syed Haider M Rizvi, Manager (Sales & Marketing), NBT represented the Trust at the Fair.

5. Warsaw International Book Fair (16 - 19 May 2013)

National Book Trust, India participated in the 4th Warsaw International Book Fair held at the National Stadium, Warsaw, Poland from 16 to 19 May 2013. About 500 exhibitors from 18 countries including Australia, Bulgaria, Taiwan, Czech Republic, France, Germany, India, Israel, Norway, Russia, Romania, Serbia, Slovakia, Spain, Ukraine, Hungary and United Kingdom participated in the Fair. India was represented by National Book Trust, India at the Fair. Dr M A Sikandar, Director, NBT had a number of meetings with Mr Grzegorz Gauden, Director, Book Institute, Poland; Ms Elzbieta Kalinowska, Deputy Director, Book Institute, Poland, Ms Aldona Zawadzka, President, Warsaw Book Fair, Mr Wlondzimierz Albin, President of Polish Chamber of Books and Ms. Monika Kapil Mohta, Indian Ambassador to Poland regarding New Delhi World Book Fair 2014.

Dr M A Sikandar, Director and Shri Kumar Vikram, Editor represented NBT at the Fair.

6. Nepal Education Book Fair (24 May - 1 June 2013)

National Book Trust, India participated in the 17th Nepal Education & Book Fair held at Bhirikuti Mandap, Kathmandu, Nepal from 24 May to 1 June 2013. The Fair was inaugurated by Shri Bairagi Kainala, Chancellor, Nepal Academy and Shri Amber Gurung, Chancellor, Nepal Academy of Music and Drama. Shri Jayant Prasad, Ambassador of India, Embassy of India, Kathmandu and Shri Meena from Nepal Bharat Library visited the NBT stall at the Fair.

Shri S K Arya and Shri Raj Kumar from Exhibition Section represented NBT at the Fair.

7. Seoul International Book Fair (19 - 23 June 2013)

National Book Trust, India participated in the Seoul International Book Fair held from 19 to 23 June 2013. India was the Guest of Honour country at the Fair. A 40 member Indian delegation led by Shri Jitin Prasada, Hon'ble Minister of State for Human Resource Development, Government of India, Shri A Sethumadhavan, Chairman, NBT, Smt. Veena Ish, Joint Secretary (Administration, Book Promotion & Copyright), MHRD, Dr M A Sikandar, Director, NBT, Shri K. Srinivasa Rao, Secretary, Sahitya Akademi, including authors, CEOs, MDs and Executives of 23 Indian publishers, participated as part of the Guest of Honour Presentation of India at the Fair. NBT as the nodal agency, facilitated the presentation. A specially designed India Pavilion in about 1,000 sqm. was set up by the NBT at the Fair in which replica of Sanchi Gate sculpted by eminent sculptor Shri Biswaji Majumdar and a replica of the standing Buddha in the Gandhara style by renowned sculptor Shri Purnendu Dey was showcased. More than 2500 titles of 23 Indian publishers who participated and nearly 800 titles of nearly 75 Indian publishers were put on display at the Pavilion. Besides, 'Illustrators' Corner' and paintings of eminent painters on the theme 'Reading Spaces' were part of the exhibition.

Shri Prasada formally inaugurated the India Pavilion by releasing children's books of National Book Trust, India brought out in Korean translation, which were distributed among Korean children who visited the Pavilion. The titles released in Korean translations included: *Holidays Have Come* by Rabindranath Tagore; *Animals You Can't Forget* by Ruskin Bond; *Ravan Remedy* by Suddhasatwa Basu; *Ripe & Ready* by Sukumar Ray; *Punti's Wedding* by Dipanwita Roy; *A Helping Hand* by Samaresh Chatterjee; *Tails* by Hydrose Aaluwa; *Who is Sharper?* by Gunamani Nath and *Chika-Chik-Chik* by Jeyanthi Manoharan. During the Fair, Indo-Korean Digital Publishing Forum, Illustrators' Workshop with 25 Korean school students, Panel Discussion on the topic *Tagore and Gandhi in Korea* and a series of B2B meetings or Rights Exchange meetings between the participating Indian publishers and Korean publishers were organised by NBT.

Several dignitaries including Ms Park Geun-hye, Hon'ble President of the Republic of South Korea, Shri Vishnu Prakash, Hon'ble Ambassador of India to South Korea visited the India Pavilion.

Shri A Sethumadhvan, Chairman, Dr M A Sikandar, Director, Ms. Farida M. Naik (Jt. Director, Admn. & Finance), Shri D. Sarkar (Dy. Director, Art), and Shri Kumar Vikram, Editor represented NBT at the Fair.

8. Colombo International Book Fair (14 - 22 September 2013)

The Trust participated in the Colombo International Book Fair held from 14 to 22 September 2013. Prof. Sunil Ariyarathne, eminent writer, film maker and Senior Professor of Sinhala

language and mass communication at Sri Jayawardanapura University inaugurated the Fair. The Colombo International Book Fair had over 400 stalls spread across 11 halls with a representation of various countries. National Book Trust, India showcased about 300 titles both in English and Tamil. NBT stall attracted a steady stream of visitors.

Dr M A Sikandar, Director and Shri T. Mathan Raj, Assistant Editor (Tamil) represented NBT at the Fair.

9. Beijing International Book Fair (28 August - 1 September 2013)

The Trust participated in the 20th Beijing International Book Fair (BIBF) held at the China International Exhibition Centre in Beijing from 28 August to 1 September 2013. The BIBF attracted over 20,000 exhibitors from 76 different countries and regions. This year the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia participated at the Fair as the Country of Honour, and Moscow as the focus city. BIBF started a new experiment this year of "Province of Honour", where Hubei was the special attraction. Many authors and publishers from Hubei province were present there. The theme of BIBF 2013 was: 'Introducing excellent books from around the world into China and leading Chinese books to the world.' The NBT stall had showcased 200 titles in English which included books of 33 Indian publishers. The NBT books were well received by the visitors to the NBT stall and many publishers showed keen interest in Indian books. During the five-day event, the fair attracted more than 300,000 visitors looking for particularly hard-to-find titles as well as foreign books.

Shri Pankaj Chaturvedi, Assistant Editor (Hindi), represented NBT at the Fair.

10. Frankfurt Book Fair (9 - 13 October 2013)

National Book Trust, India participated in the Frankfurt Book Fair held from 9 to 13 October 2013. Brazil was the Guest of Honour country at the Fair. Over 7,300 publishers, distributors from across the world participated in the Fair. The Indian participation at the Fair was housed in a specially designed India National Pavilion in Hall No. 8. Created by the National Book Trust, India, the Pavilion had a strong presence of 21 publishers from across the country, including NBT and Sahitya Akademi. Shri Sunder Kumar, Councillor (Economics), Indian High Commission, Germany inaugurated the India Pavilion. Over 300 books brought out recently by publishers from across the country on a wide array of subjects was the focus of attention among the visitors. Keeping in view its rising status, NBT organised an Indo-Brazil Business Round Table in association with FBF and German Book Office, New Delhi at the Pavilion. Chaired by Shri Sethumadhavan, the forum, among other things, discussed ways of literary cooperation between the two countries. As part of the BRICS initiative, both the countries sought to participate in each other's book fairs and strengthen literary exchanges. With children's books being the special focus at the Fair, participants from both sides suggested to initially take up children's books. Meetings were also held

with various booksellers associations of USA, France and Canada as well as with Sharjah Book Fair, Tokyo Book Fair and London Book Fair. 11. Sharjah International Book (6 - 16 November 2013)

The Trust participated in the Sharjah International Book Fair held at the Sharjah Expo Centre from 6 to 16 November 2013. The Fair was inaugurated by His Highness, Dr Shaikh Sultan Bin Mohammed Al Qasimi, Supreme Council member and ruler of Sharjah. NBT participated with select contingent of 60 Indian Publishers. Housed in a special India Pavilion, the Indian stalls witnessed a long line of visitors for trade enquiries as well as to see the hundreds of Indian books on display. NBT also participated in the Rights Table held from 3 to 5 November 2013 with over 200 recent titles. At the end of the session which had more than 100 publishers from across the globe, NBT signed interest agreements for books on Gandhi with publishers from Syria, Azerbaijan and Egypt. Among the Indian celebrities who visited the NBT stall included Dr APJ Abdul Kalam, former President of India, Prof. K V Thomas, Minister of State, Govt. of India, Shri Adoor Gopalakrishnan, eminent film maker, Shri Ruskin Bond, popular children's writer, Shri Farooq Sheikh and Ms Deepti Naval, theatre and film personalities and Shri Ravinder Singh.

Shri Samaresh Kumar, Asst. Director (I&P) and Shri Rajiv Choudhury, Asst. Director (Exhibition) represented NBT at the Fair.

12. Bologna Children's Book Fair (24 - 27 March 2014)

National Book Trust, India participated in the Bologna Children's Book Fair held from 24 to 27 March 2014. This year more than 1,200 exhibitors from 74 countries participated in the Fair. Brazil was the guest country of honour at the Fair. More than 30,000 illustrators, writers, exhibitors and trade operators from all over the world visited the Fair. National Book Trust, India put up an exhibition of selected 161 books from 20 publishers from across the country. A special catalogue of these books was also published and distributed among other material to the visitors. The NBT stall functioned as a meeting place for trade visitors from India, who didn't have a stall. Publishers like Tulika, Karadi Tales, Duckbill and Ratna Sagar etc used this facility. There were good enquiries for rights of NBT books especially from African countries like Ivory Coast and Ghana.

Shri Rubin DCruz, Assistant Editor (Malyalam) represented NBT at the Fair.

Besides, the Trust also participated in the Meeting of Board of Advisors for the Asian

Festival of Children's Content held at Singapore, Book Release Function of NBT title and Meeting with SAARC Cultural Centre's for bringing out publication jointly held at Colombo, Sri Lanka. The details of which are as follows:

13. Asian Festival of Children's Content (25 - 30 May 2013)

National Book Trust, India participated in the Asian Festival of Children's Content (AFCC) held at the National Library Board, Singapore from 25 to 30 May 2013. Malaysia was the Focus Country for this year's AFCC. Malaysian show included an Illustrators' Corner, several interactive sessions and talks by authors, editors and illustrators, book launch programmes, exhibition of children's books, a Rights Table and a Malaysian Cultural Evening. The Indian stand in this year's AFCC showcased more than 100 select children's books. In the Board of Advisor's Meeting held on 28 May 2013, the decision to project India as the Focus Country in AFCC 2014 was taken.

Shri Manas Ranjan Mahapatra, Editor (English) represented NBT at AFCC.

14. Meeting with SAARC Cultural Centre and Book Release Function, Colombo, Sri Lanka (19 – 21 August, 2013)

A meeting with SAARC Cultural Centre for bringing out publications jointly was held at Colombo, Sri Lanka from 19 to 21 August 2013. In the meeting with Dr G L W Samarasinghe, Director, SAARC Cultural Centre, Dr M A Sikandar, Director, NBT made a proposal regarding the regular participation of SAARC Cultural Centre in New Delhi World Book Fair basis and invited SAARC writers for book reading sessions and book release functions, seminars, etc. in the background of New Delhi World Book Fair. It was also agreed in the meeting that it would be a good idea to start a separate series called 'SAARC Literature' by NBT for which the SAARC Cultural Centre will be providing financial assistance to NBT to support and sustain publication under this series in NBT on long term basis.

A book release function was also organised where the NBT title *Mirrored Images: An Anthology of Srilankan Poems*, edited by Prof. Rajiva Wijesinha, a literary critic and a Member of Parliament, Sri Lanka was released. The anthology contains 92 poems translated from Sinhalese and Tamil languages into English by Sri Lankan poets.

The personal touch which these letters communicated is lost by exchanging letters through internet and SMS, a means which is increasingly being resorted to by the younger generation."

He congratulated and commended NBT for having Prof. Beteille to deliver the lecture. Himself a prolific writer, Dr Jadhav was enthusiastic of books brought out by NBT. 5. Maharashtra

Shri Satish Kalsekar, distinguished Marathi writer, inaugurated the exhibition Prof. Rajan Gavas, Head, Dept. of Marathi and Sahitya Akademi winner were present as Guests of Honour and Shri B N Patil, Kolhapur District Council Education Officer, Mrs. Kamble, Danol, village Sarpanch, Shri Suresh Kamble, Kolhapur District Council Member and Danoli High School Committee members were also present on the occasion. In the book release session, 10 Marathi titles for children, published by the NBT were released by Sh. Rajabhau Shirguppe, well known Marathi author. Mrs. Sucheta Padalkar, Principal, Srujanand High School, Kolhapur and Shri Satish Desphande presented their views on the books released. Prof. Rafiq Suraj, well-known Marathi poet, interacted

with the audience in the Meet-the-Author session. Shri Suraj spoke on his creative journey as a poet. ACTIVITIES IN NORTH EAST

National Book Trust, India, under its Development Project for North Eastern Region, a special scheme for Northeast, organised several book promotional activities in the year 2013-2014. Like the past few years, the year 2013-2014 has been an eventful and successful year for NBT as far as setting new trends in book promotional activities in the Northeast is concerned. Publishers, booksellers, authors, NGOs and the booklovers extended their help in NBT's effort of bringing all the stakeholders under one roof thereby giving a new impetus to the ever-growing reading movement in Northeast. In the process, the Trust has largely been successful in widening its readership in Northeast.

Literary Programme in Gangtok

National Book Trust, India in collaboration with the Cultural Affairs & Heritage Department, Government of Sikkim and Cinedarbaar organised a two-day literary programme titled *Ten*, *Ten*, *Ten* at Manan Kendra in Gangtok on 8 & 9 November 2013. The programme was part of NBT's efforts to promote books and reading in the North-eastern states of the country.

Inaugurating the literary festival, Ms Nalini G. Pradhan, Secretary, Cultural Affairs & Heritage Department, Government of Sikkim and the







Chief Guest at the function thanked NBT for organising such programmes that promote reading culture among the youth, that too at a time when technology and e-books are a cause of decline towards the reading culture. The two-day event was a fusion of tradition and literature. It started off with the presentation of *Dastongoi*—the lost art form of Urdu storytelling—by the artists Nadeem Shah and Surender Dhingra. This was followed by a talk on *Folklores through a Scientific Eye* by Dr Ayeja Jha, Head, Department of Management Studies, Sikkim Manipal Institute of Technology, Shri Salil Mukhia, co-founder of Acoustic Traditional, put up a performance exploring the oral folklores and storytelling traditions in the session on *Tribal Oral Storytelling*.

Nepali being an important language spoken by the majority of people in Sikkim, a discussion was held on *Nepali Literature and Its Current Scenario*. Prof. Balaram Pandey from Sikkim University spoke at length about Nepali literature.

The last session held was a Poet's Meet where Apsara Dahai and Meena Subba rendered their poems to a packed audience.

The second day hosted a discussion on the book, Legends of the Lepchas: Folktales from Sikkim, where the author, Ms Yishey Doma, spoke about the book and interacted with the audience. The book traces the origin of the Lepchas through folktales. The next session saw panel discussions on the following topics: Blogging as the Emerging New Media, Word of Mouth as in Oral Storytelling Traditions and its Relevance in the Urban Context and Publishing Scene in Sikkim — its Future and the Importance in the Local Literary Scenario.

The two-day event concluded with the screening of the film, *Tony Takitani*, which is a 2004 Japanese film directed by Jun Ichikawa, based on the short story by Haruki Murakami.

Celebrating National Education Day

National Book Trust, India in collaboration with the Sikkim Akademi organised a Special Book Exhibit at Nepali Sahitya Parishad Bhawan, Gangtok from 8 to 11 November 2013, to celebrate the National Education Day. Special exhibit of NBT books ranging from biographies, fiction, non-fiction, essays, children's literature, to books on science & technology, social and political sciences as well as books on folklore were displayed in English, Hindi, Nepali, Bhutia, Lepcha and Bangla languages. Many school children, teachers and book lovers from across the town visited the book exhibition, and bought books of their choice.

Book Promotion Centre in Guwahati

National Book Trust, India, set up its Book Promotion Centre (Grantha Bikash Kendra) at Asom Rashtrabhasha Prasar Samiti Building, Hedayatpur, Guwahati. The centre was inaugurated at a function on 15 March 2014 by Dr Mridul Hazarika, Vice Chancellor, Guwahati University. In his inaugural address, Dr Hazarika hoped that the centre would be a platform to bring students back to the fascinating world of books and would be an important step towards that end.

Appreciating NBT's role in promoting books, Dr Lakshminandan Bora, eminent litterateur and Guest of Honour at the function urged the reading public to fully utilize the facilities in the Centre. Dr Khirada Kumar Saikia, Mantri, Asom Rashtrabhasha Prasar Samiti and Guest of Honour on the occasion, promised all kind of help from the Samiti in NBT's endeavour to promote books and reading habit in Assam.

In his presidential remarks, Shri A Sethumadhavan, Chairman, NBT and eminent Malayalam writer, said that the centre would just not be another book selling point. Rather it will encourage literary gatherings and book promotional events by different organisations working for the cause of books. Earlier, in his welcome address, Dr M A Sikandar, Director, NBT, spoke on NBT's plan to set up similar book promotion centres in different states of the country.

Six recently published titles in Asamiya were also released at the function. These included: Random Curiosity, Easy Guide to Ear Nose and Throat, The Great Hedge of India, Subhadra Kumari Chauhan Kee Shreshtha Kahaniyan, Mulk Raj Anand: Role and Achievement and The Making and Working of Indian Constitution.

ACTIVITIES IN JAMMU AND KASHMIR

National Book Trust, India has been organising book fairs, mobile exhibitions and other book-related activities like panel discussions, book release functions, seminars etc across the country to promote book mindedness among people especially among youth and making low-cost books available to book lovers. Panel Discussion (2 to 3 December 2013)

National Book Trust, India organised a two-day panel discussion on the topic *Kashmiri Language and Literature* at Dhanwantri Library, Jammu University from 2 to 3 December 2013. The discussion was organised in collaboration with University of Jammu.

Kashmiri language experts observed that Kashmiri being the oldest language of north India deserves the status of classical language. They said that "Kashmiri language has a rich treasure of literature spread over more than seven hundred years in published form. The history of Kashmiri poetry is older than that of English language and this language has produced poets of international standard like Lalded and Sheikhul Alam in fourteenth century AD. The poetic vision and expression of these poets of Kashmir is of high standard which suggests that it must have a long tradition and legacy of literary expression behind it."

The Kashmiri litterateurs who participated in the panel discussion included Dr Aziz Hajini, Md Yusuf Taing, Ms Rukhshana Jameel, Shri Mansoor Banihali, Shri Pyarelal Hatash and Shri BN Betab. A three-day exhibition of books was also held on the occasion from 1 to 3 December 2013.

ACTIVITIES BY NATIONAL CENTRE FOR CHILDREN'S LITERATURE

The National Centre for Children's Literature (NCCL) was established in 1993 by the Government of India as a part of NBT to monitor, coordinate, plan and aid the publication of children's literature in various Indian languages. Besides developing a Library-cum-Documentation Centre of children's literature, the Centre is engaged in organising seminars, workshops and exhibitions, and also, is actively promoting the habit of reading at school level by encouraging the setting up of Readers' Clubs. During the year under review, over 1,000 Readers' Clubs were established across the country.

The activities undertaken by NCCL during the financial year 2013-14 were as follows:

1. On the occasion of World Book Day, a seminar on Reading Habit was held at Dharamshala, Himachal Pradesh on 23 April 2013. The seminar was organised in association with the School of Education, Central University of Himachal Pradesh. The speakers on the occasion were: Dr Shekhar Sarkar, author, Dr Arvind Kumar Jha, Dean of School of Education, Prof. I V Malhan, Dean of School of Mathematics, Prof. Arvind Agrawal, Dean of School of Social Sciences and Dr Rabindranath







Manukonda, Dean of School of Journalism, Mass Communication and New Media. A workshop for children was also organised at the Lower Tibetan School, Dharamshala on 23 April 2013.

- 2. - 4. On this occasion, a storytelling session for school children was Organised at the NCCL Library and NBT Bookshop in which Shri Prakash Manu and Ms Paro Anand, renowned authors for children interacted with school children. Students from various Kendriya Vidyalayas of Delhi participated in the session.
- 5. An interactive discussion on the topic *Tales for Today's Children: Connecting to the Roots* was Organised in association with India Trade Promotion Organization and Federation of Indian Publishers during Delhi Book Fair 2013 at Pragati Maidan, New Delhi on 29 August 2013. SALES & MARKETING

The Trust publishes moderately priced books for all segments of the society and for all age groups in Hindi, English and all major Indian languages. The Trust organizes various book exhibitions, book fairs and mobile book exhibitions through specially designed mobile exhibition vans to ensure the availability of the Trust's publications across the country, especially in remote areas, and small and medium towns. The NBT books are also being sold from its bookshops located at it office in Vasant Kunj, Kashmere Gate and Vishwavidhyalaya Metro Stations, Daryaganj in New Delhi and at its Regional Offices in Bengaluru, Kolkata and Mumbai. The bookshops at Chennai and Guwahati have also become operational.

Besides, NBT books are also available online. Individuals and organisations can avail this facility and order books online.

The Trust has developed an excellent network of its authorised booksellers as Agents and Distributors throughout the country. During the year it has added 51 new booksellers.

NBT Book Club Scheme is also playing a major role in promotion of the sale of books and reading habit. 4,962 new Book Club members have been enrolled during the year 2013-14.

The Mobile Book Exhibition (*Pustak Parikrama*) programme is another important mode for the sale promotion of books and reading habit. The Trust has conducted 39 such Pustak Parikaramas throughout the country. The gross sale generated is Rs.63.69 lakh from these exhibitions. The Trust has generated gross sale of Rs. 2,268.25 lakh and Revenue generated from the sale of books has been Rs.1,759.02 lakh.

NATIONAL BOOK TRUST, INDIA **FINANCIALASSISTANCE** PROGRAMME (NBT FAP)

In order to promote and pursue translations of Indian books into foreign languages, the Trust initiated a financial assistance programme to foreign publishers. The programme will provide suitable incentive in the form of financial assistance to foreign publishers for translation of original Indian writings published by Indian publishers in English, Hindi and other Indian languages into foreign languages.

The programme covers broad categories of fiction, non-fiction, science and technology and books for children, except dictionaries, magazines, journals, text books for schools/colleges and professional courses like medicine, engineering, pure & applied sciences, business administration.

In order to give particular focus on writings in Indian languages where an English translation is not available, and to promote such writings abroad, the NBT would facilitate its translation into English, and in such areas the NBT would bear 50% of the translation fee. Open to foreign publishers, the programme has elicited a lot of interest among a cross section of publishers both from India and abroad.



During the period financial assistance was provided for the book *The Missing Queen* by Samhita Arni, first published by Zubaan, for its translation into Italian. The Italian edition was published by Lit Edizioni, Italy. Besides, two proposals from France and Germany are under consideration.

As part of this programme, the Trust organized the second

Rights Table Forum for publishers during the New Delhi World Book Fair, 2014. The New Delhi Rights Table was a two day event that brought together publishers, rights-agents and editors from India and abroad to network and explore business opportunities together. Organised as B2B match making sessions, it enabled the participants to book their own Rights Table, meet and present their products and ideas.

A successful initiative, the New Delhi Rights Table was a major attraction at the New Delhi World Book Fair. It attracted over 60 publishers from India and abroad. Besides, major publishers from across India, foreign participants included publishers from UK, Canada and USA.

TRAINING COURSE IN BOOK **PUBLISHING**

National Book Trust, India organises Training Course in Book Publishing across the country to help participants take up publishing as a career. The Training Course focuses on various aspects of publishing like developing manuscripts, editorial process, production and marketing of books, export of books, Copyright and other legal issues of publishing, sale of Rights, etc. Members of the faculty drawn from leading universities, institutions and publishing houses give an insight into publishing industry to the participants through interactive sessions.

During the Financial Year 2013-2014, two publishing courses in Srinagar and New Delhi were organised by the Trust.

Training Course in Book Publishing, New Delhi (2-28 September 2013)

The Trust organised the four-week long Training Course in Book Publishing at Nehru Bhawan, New Delhi from 2 to 28 September 2013. This year 36 participants from various parts of the country enrolled for the course. Some of the participants were sent for internship to different publishing houses. Eminent professionals from the publishing industry interacted with the participants during the course.



Training Course in Book Publishing, Srinagar (19-24 August 2013)

The Trust organised a one-week Training Course in Book Publishing in Srinagar from 19 to 24 August 2013. The course was organised in collaboration with Allama Iqbal Library, University of Kashmir. A one week long course at Srinagar

was attended by about 35 participants and about 7 eminent professional from the publishing industry shared their experience with the participants. The course was well appreciated by the participants.

Post Graduate Diploma in Book Publishing Launched, New Delhi (4 July 2013)

Over the last few decades, the publishing industry is growing and more and more new publishing houses are coming up. This phenomenal growth in turn has created a need for skilled professionals in the industry. To meet the demand of contemporary publishing industry for professionals, Ambedkar University of Delhi (AUD) in collaboration with the National Book Trust, India initiated a one year full-time Post Graduate Diploma in Publishing. The course was inaugurated by Smt Sheila Dikshit, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Delhi at a launch held at India International Centre, New Delhi on 4 July 2013. Prof. Shyam B Menon, Vice Chancellor, AUD, Prof. Chandan Mukherjee, Pro-Vice Chancellor, AUD and Dr M A Sikandar, Director, NBT were present on the occasion.

ASSISTANCE FOR PUBLICATION OF BOOKS

Financial assistance is provided by the Trust under its Subsidy Scheme for publication of books.

Scheme for the Subsidized Publication of Books

Through this Subsidy Scheme, the NBT promotes publication of reasonably priced books for students and teachers of Indian universities and technical institutes by providing royalty to authors and financial assistance to publishers for bringing out books which could serve as textbooks, discipline-oriented reference material or reference books.

During the period under review, two titles were published under the Scheme and the total amount of subsidy given was Rs.7,05,458.00.

Schedule-22—SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. ACCOUNTING CONVENTION

The financial statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention, unless otherwise stated and on the accrual method of accounting.

2. INVENTORYVALUATION

Raw material and finished goods are valued at lower of cost and net realizable value.

3. INVESTMENTS

- Investments classified as "long term investments" are carried at cost. 3.1
- 3.2 Investments classified as "Current" are carried at lower of cost and fair value. Provision for shortfall in the value of such investments is made for each investment considered individually and not on a global basis.
- 3.3 Cost includes acquisition expenses like brokerage, transfer stamps.

4. FIXEDASSETS

Fixed Assets are stated at cost of acquisition inclusive of inward freight, duties and taxes and incidental and direct expenses related to acquisition.

5. DEPERCIATION

- Depreciation is provided on Written Down Value Method as per rates specified in the Income Tax Act 1961 and as per Income Tax Rules 1962 as amended from time to time.
- In respect of additions to/deductions from Fixed Assets during the year, 5.2 Depreciation is considered on pro-rata basis.
- Amounts upto Rs.5000.00 incurred on capital items/assets are treated as 5.3 consumed during the year and transferred to consumable items account.

6. ACCOUNTINGFORSALES

Sales are net of Sales Returns. Rebate and Trade Discount.

7. GOVERNMENT GRANTS/SUBSIDIES

- 7.1 Government grants of the nature of contribution towards capital cost of setting up projects are treated as Capital Reserve.
- 7.2 Government grants are accounted on realization basis.

8. FOREIGN CURRENCY TRANSACTIONS

Transactions denominated in foreign currency are accounted at the exchange rate prevailing at the date of the transaction.

9. LEASE

Lease rentals are expensed with reference to Lease terms.

10. RETIREMENTBENEFITS

- 10.1 The Trust regulates payment of Pension as per the Rules laid down under CCS (Pension) Rules. Actuarial Liability towards Pension upto the year end has worked out to `39803627/-.
- 10.2 Liability towards Gratuity payable on death/retirement of employees is accrued based on actuarial valuation at `10041704/- upto the year end.
- 10.3 Actuarial Liability for accumulated Leave Encashment benefit to the employees is accrued and computed on the assumption that employees are entitled to receive the benefits and has been estimated at `5739687/- as at the year-end.

11. REVENUERECOGNITION

Revenue is recognized only when the books have been dispatched from NBT Godowns and the purchaser has become legally liable to pay.

12. ACCOUNTINGFORANNUALMAINTENANCE CONTRACTS

Annual Maintenance Contracts are accounted for at the time of making actual payment.

13. GENERALPROVIDENT FUNDACCOUNT

General Provident Fund Account is not merged in the main Account. However, a set of the Account is annexed for reference.

14. ACCOUNTINGFOR ROYALTY PAYMENTS

The Trust publishes books in various languages and under various series. As per the approved policy of Royalty, the Trust pays 50% of the total Royalty due to the Author immediately on publication of a title. This payment is treated as an Advance Royalty and is adjusted against the Royalty accruing annually to the Author against sale in the subsequent years. After this advance is fully adjusted against Sales Royalty, the balance 50% Royalty is released based on the annual quantum of sale of the title.

The Publishing expenditure for the current financial year is `1153.01 lakh as against ` 1104.32 lakh of previous year. Publishing expenditure is directly linked with sale of Trust's publications.
