- c. What does Tom Jones learn during his journey from innocence to experience?

- a. How are Sir Walter's values displayed through his words and actions? Consider his relationship with his tenants, those who work for him, and each of his daughters.
- b. In all of her novels, Austen casts a gentle, satirical eye on English society. In *Persuasion*, her gaze seems more critical. Discuss in detail.
- c. The characters of *Persuasion* are subject to different types of persuasion. Some are persuaded by rank/class/family connections, some by self-interest, while others are persuaded by self-importance. Discuss.
